What is PBIS....

PBIS stands for: Positive Behavior Intervention Support

Just as we teach and give feedback in academic areas, we need to teach and give feedback in behavioral areas.

PBIS includes:

- Teaching “The Trojan Way” to our students to show them how to be respectful, responsible and safe in all areas of school.
- Common language to review expectations with Listening Larry (grades K-1) and Champs (grades 2-5)

CHAMPS stands for:

**Conversation – Help – Activity – Movement – Participation – Success**

School staff reinforces these principals by giving out “Hershey passes” to students they see are following “The Trojan Way” by being respectful, responsible and/or safe. Students who earn Hershey passes are entered into a weekly drawing and if their name is drawn, they are able to pick a reward.
