ADVANCED COURSES

Rowland Hall offers 13 AP courses, 7 Advanced Topics (AT), and 4 Advanced Research (AR) courses. Students who take an AP course are required to take the corresponding AP exam. Our AT courses are designed by our faculty and are as rigorous as AP courses, focusing on inquiry-based learning. AT courses provide the opportunity to tackle real-world problems, dig deeper into topics of interest to students and teachers, and provide more hands-on practice, like frequent lab work, field studies, and trips, as well as collaboration between departments. Advanced Research (AR) courses are designed to engage students beyond the AP/AT curriculum with an opportunity to learn college-level research skills in a particular discipline, develop an original thesis, and conduct research under the guidance of an expert in a particular field. Some AR courses offer the opportunity to present at a conference, publish original work, and/or work with a university professor.

- AP, AT, and AR courses are weighted and add 1.0 point per class to the GPA.
- Rowland Hall does not award an A+ for any class.
- AR Chemistry, AR Biology, & AR Humanities are the only courses that have AP/AT prerequisites, making them the most rigorous courses available.

ACADEMIC POLICIES

- In 2023 - 2024, Rowland Hall implemented the following policy changes:
 - Trimesters were eliminated. All courses are on a semester or year-long schedule.
 - World Religions is no longer a graduation requirement starting with the class of 2026.
- Rowland Hall does not calculate class rank.
- Academic work completed at other institutions will not appear on the transcript, nor be included in the Cumulative GPA.
- Personal Fitness, Physical Education, Athletic Teams, Rowmark, & Student Council are non-GPA bearing courses. As of 2021-2022, Student Council is no longer a class that is reported on the transcript.
- In 2022 - 2023, Rowland Hall removed the 4 core course limit for Rowmark student-athletes.

DISCIPLINARY DISCLOSURE POLICY

Rowland Hall's expectation is that students will comply with college reporting requirements and will answer questions about their disciplinary history honestly. Our college counselors are available to assist students in this process.
