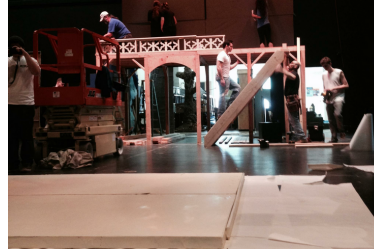
## Professional Theatre

In the Theatre Pathway, students are exposed to the many acting methodologies, they explore script and character analysis, performance, resume writing, head shots, stage combat, and yoga centric movement. Students gain the skills necessary to write scripts for various audiences, from children to adults.

Students also learn how to write movie/play reviews, book jackets, instructional guides, and author profiles. Students learn the technical aspects of theatre, including lighting and sound design, set building, make-up, costuming, marketing, directing, and producing. Each course offers the opportunity to attend Professional Theatre and participate in workshops and presentations led by experts in the field.
