Mrs. Christine Morris reported the following:

- WHS students took the SEL survey on Friday, September 1, and we have also completed the first SEL lesson for the first quarter.
- Guidance held their first Lunch and Learn. It was on suicide prevention being that September
 was suicide prevention month. Ms. Carrigan also sent out several informational emails to the
 faculty and staff. Coach Logan held a second Lunch and Learn on Interview Skills. Mrs.
 Thompson from Celanese spoke.
- Beta Club Induction was held Tuesday, September 19. 45 new members were inducted, there are currently 168 members total.
- Drive to Zero was on campus Monday, September 18, and Tuesday, September 19.
 The DRIVE to Zero Program is STP's newest Outreach and Education component that is
 aimed at addressing unsafe driving behaviors before they occur. The program highlights the
 negative consequences of distracted and impaired driving behaviors. College and Career
 Prep and Woodruff 101 classes participated in this program.
- Guidance held for juniors and seniors an Ed-Op Day on Wednesday, September 20. There were 71 colleges in attendance for students to gather information from and ask questions.
- Interims went out on Wednesday, September 13. An all call was made to parents
 encouraging them to reach out to any subject teacher if they had any questions or concerns.

Instructional Reports

Dr. Aaron Fulmer reported the following:

- The Accreditation Option form must be submitted to the SC Department of Education in October. With this submission, District Four certifies that the district and schools hold Cognia accreditation. Districts must hold Cognia accreditation or utilize the accreditation services of the SCDE.
- School literacy teams are reviewing ELA achievement data, rating their schools on literacy
 practices listed in the Read to Succeed Exemplary Literacy Reflection Tool, and setting goals
 for the upcoming school year. The Read to Succeed Literacy Plans are due to the SC
 Department of Education in October.
- 3. The next Induction class will meet on October 9th. The October session will address the following topics: Trauma informed practices, adverse childhood experiences, skills of resilience, classroom management, and SC Teaching Standards under the Environment domain.

- 4. Administrators will be attending the USC Upstate Recruitment Fair on October 10th. With the teacher shortage, it is important to recruit early, particularly at the local colleges and universities.
- 5. Teachers will be conducting parent conferences throughout the month of October to discuss student progress. Conferences may be scheduled in person, online, or over the phone. Teachers will maintain a log of these conferences.

Mrs. Ann Hodge reported the following:

- In addition to selecting and appointing representatives for their School Improvement Councils, we are in the process of updating their SIC bylaws. The school bylaws will follow the state law requirements and will mimic Sample SIC Bylaws.
- 2. The FY24 Title I Grant has been approved by the State Department. *Title I, Part A (Title I) of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESEA) provides financial assistance to local educational agencies (LEAs) and schools with high numbers or high percentages of children from low-income families to help ensure that all children meet challenging state academic standards. Funds can only be used to supplement, not supplant what we are already doing.*
- 3. The FY24 Title II Grant has also been approved by the State Department. The purpose of the Title II, Part A grant is:
 - to increase student achievement consistent with challenging State academic standards,
 - · to improve the quality and effectiveness of teachers, principals, and other school leaders,
 - to increase the number of teachers, principals and other school leaders who are effective in improving student academic achievement in schools, and
 - to provide low-income and minority student greater access to effective teachers, principals and other school leaders.
- 4. The FY24 Title III Grant is due on October 13th.
 - Title III is responsible for the oversight of the language instruction of MLs and immigrant children and youth. This is accomplished by:
 - administering grant programs that help children develop proficiency in English and achieve grade-level content standards.
 - recommending policies and promoting best practices for meeting the needs of MLs.
 - strengthening collaboration and coordination among federal, state, and local programs serving MLs, monitoring funded programs, and providing technical assistance that addresses outcomes and accountability.
- 5. The FY24 Title IV Grant has been submitted and is awaiting approval.

 The Title IV, Part A the Student Support and Academic Enrichment (SSAE) program is intended to ensure all children graduate from high school ready to thrive in college and careers by increasing the capacity of State education agencies (SEAs), local education agencies (LEAs), schools, and local communities to:
 - Provide all students with access to a well-rounded education
 - Improve school conditions for student learning
 - Improve the use of technology in order to improve the academic achievement and digital literacy of all students
- 6. Each year, all districts must prepare a comprehensive annual reading proficiency plan for prekindergarten through twelfth grade by responding to questions from the Read to Succeed Office at the SCDE. We are also required to monitor our plan and use data to make improvements. Once all the school reflection tools are complete, I will complete a district literacy plan based on the school plans. New SMART goals will be developed based on progress regarding the SMART goals from the previous year.
- 7. Staff members must complete McKinney-Vento training each year. The district provides a short video training option for employees.

- 8. The Federal and State audit for Spartanburg Four will be on March 6, 2024. We are required to submit documents at least 30 days prior to the audit and have documents available on-site for the visit. We are being audited on our adherence to state and federal regulations.
- 9. A sample board policy is in progress to address educating students and parents about Gavin's Law. Schools will be required to inform students about the law and the dangers of sexual extortion.

Mrs. Jennifer Turner reported the following:

- 1. As part of legislation Proviso 1.76, all districts must ensure all students in first-eighth grades are assessed using a state approved interim assessment tool for fall, winter, and spring. Spartanburg Four has completed the fall window testing requirement for this Proviso and will soon submit all data to SCDE for review. Districts are required to have a percentage rate of 85% or higher or ten percent of funding will be withheld until the data is submitted. Spartanburg Four met this requirement with a 96.8% completion rate. As in the past, these scores will continue to be used with computerized software to provide an individualized learning experience.
- 2. State mandated preschool and kindergarten assessments are well underway. GOLD (4K) and KRA (5K) will be completed on or before October 16th.
- 3. The 2023 PSAT will be given to students in 8th grade on October 18th and students in 10th grade on October 17th.
- 4. Seniors needing to retake the Career Readiness Test will be given this opportunity on November 1st.

Ms. Rachel Traynham provided the following report:

SPED

- 1. We will hold our county-wide Special Education Director Meeting at McCarthy-Teszler on October 5th, 2023.
- 2. I will participate in the state-wide Special Education Director Summit in Columbia October 12-13.

Nursing

- 1. The Employee Health Fair will be held November 3rd in the Woodruff High School Cafeteria.
- 2. COVID 19- We have had 30 staff members to test positive to date. We have had 67 students test positive to date.

Mental Health

- The number of student referrals for Mental Health Services continues to increase. We
 continue to conduct Behavioral Threat Assessments and Columbia Screeners at an increased
 rate. We have 2 District Four Counselors and 1 Department of Mental Health Counselor
 serving our students. M-F each week.
- The South Carolina Department of Education recently sent a survey to each district in the state inquiring about Mental Health Services and Direct Counseling Services available to students and staff.

Multi-Lingual Learners

1. We are serving about 130 Multi-Lingual Learners. That number has increased from last year's numbers. We currently have 2 full time ML teachers.

- 4. **Generator for District Office Server Room** We are working on a proposal for a backup generator to maintain power and air conditioning to our server room at the District Office. These servers control computers, security cameras, telephones, and data backups.
