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# Woodworking

The Woodworking pathway takes students from the basics of construction processes to very advanced techniques and methods. Students begin with basic power and machine tool use, then advance to design, planning, and cost estimation for their own personal projects. Safety is infused throughout the program. Students will create projects that will take them on this journey from simple trace and cut to actual plan and cut-list creation of a cabinet. Students create their own plans, materials lists, cutting lists, and they select and purchase their own materials.
