The Automotive pathway provides instruction and hands-on experience with the operation of repair facilities, repair skills for ASE Education Foundation specialties, and installation methods for aftermarket electronics. Paid work and internships are part of the program offering students valuable experience and an entry into the profession. Students will have instruction in automobile service and repair, shop safety, engine repair, automatic transmissions and transaxles, manual drive train and axles, suspension and steering, brakes, electrical and electronic systems, heating and air conditioning, and engine performance.
