The Different Classes of Drugs and their Chemistry

<u>Key Term</u>	<u>Definition</u>
Stimulant	A synthetic opioid that is 50 times stronger than Heroin. The amount that can fit on the tip of a pencil can kill the user.
Cocaine	Marketed as a “party drug”. It can kill the user by causing the brain to overheat.
Synthetic Drug	Marijuana is this classification of drug. It can cause the user to see things that are not real.
Fentanyl	A drug that is made from chemicals with no natural basis.
Ecstasy	A class of drug that speeds up the central nervous system making the user appear hyperactive.
Hallucinogen	The acids and solvents left in the pit where cocaine is made.
Oxycodone	A stimulant that can cause a heart attack →even on the first use.
Methamphetamine	Produced illegally using toxic chemicals in unclean, unregulated conditions.
Cocaine	A synthetic opioid sold as a painkiller. One of the deadliest drugs sold in the U.S.
