Background:

The Manchester Board of Education applied for and was awarded a grant to be used to support the REACT I Adult Ed College Transition Pilot program. This is a 5-year (entering year 5) pilot program which proposes to address the needs of a group of 20 to 25 students who fall below the Federal definition of Ability to Benefit. The students have attained a high school diploma or its equivalent and require intensive postsecondary developmental education that will allow them to enroll directly in a credit bearing program of higher learning.

<u>Discussion/Analysis</u>: Funds will be used to offer pathways to postsecondary education for high school graduated adults. The program will provide preparatory support to meet the Accuplacer criteria for entry level college courses. This program will partner with the neighborhood community college, Manchester Community College.

Background:

Manchester Community College and Manchester Adult and Continuing Education have had a successful partnership for the past several years through the Reaching Education Achievement for College Transition (REACT II) program which provides a supportive educational environment for students who want to transition to college, but whose assessment scores place them below the Intensive level of remediation. This 2-year pilot program will give students the opportunity to earn three college credits in Student Development, First Year Experience and complete the equivalent of Manchester Community College's developmental Math and English sequence. Students receive support services, career and academic counseling, participate in cultural enrichment excursions that support their learning program, meet and learn with other students with the same goals and receive continued support from Manchester Community College staff after completion of the program.

<u>Discussion/Analysis</u>: Funds will be used to offer pathways to postsecondary education for high school seniors and high school graduated adults. The program will provide preparatory support to meet the Accuplacer criteria for entry level college courses.

<u>Background:</u> Manchester Head Start receives an annual grant from the State Department of Education for the expansion of its services to low-income families.

<u>Discussion/Analysis</u>: These funds will be used to expand services to an additional class of 15 low-income preschoolers, in a full-day, full-year model.

<u>Financial Impact:</u> Grant funds cover 75% of the cost of implementation for this program expansion, with the remaining 25% coming from parent fees and State day care subsidies to parents.

















Overview of Manchester's CMT Data





CMT - % Students At or Above Goal Science – Grade 8




