Honors (H) and Advanced Placement (AP) Courses

Honors and AP courses are **equivalent**. Enrollment requires department approval.

Honors courses either precede or follow an AP course. Honors Modern World History and Honors Physics replace AP courses not in our curriculum. All Honors and AP courses extend well beyond exam prep and challenge students to understand, create and express knowledge in multiple ways.
