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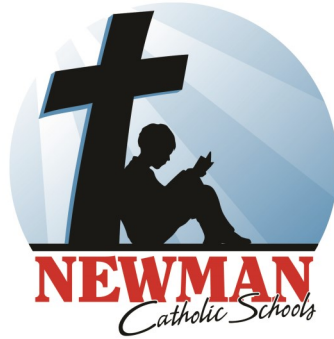

Dear Parents and Guardians,

You may have heard your students speaking about "Cardinal Character" and our efforts to treat others with kindness each and every day. This initiative, which started at the MS/HS last year, has spread to all of our Newman buildings as we look to find ways to be responsible, respectful, use integrity, show empathy, and always have gratitude. We hope to "B.R.I.N.G. IT" as we show that others matter.

October is a month of many celebrations. It is National Fire Prevention Month and National School Lunch month and we are grateful for the ways these people keep us safe and feed us great lunches, respectively. We celebrate Columbus Day, Red Ribbon Week, and recognize the importance of always being kind and respectful during Anti-bullying month. We pray for all teachers on World Teacher Day.

In our Catholic schools we honor the feast days of our saints (St. Francis of Assisi is a favorite) and we celebrate October as the Month of the Rosary. Students are learning a variety of strategies to improve their reading skills and we are focusing on improved writing skills, as well. We love to come together with our school family whenever we have the opportunity. This school year, we will have four All-School Mass celebrations, not just one. The first All-School Mass will be held on October 12, at Newman High School. Thank you to a wonderful donor, the busing has been paid for. More information regarding these Masses will be coming soon.

Students in 5K have been testing in Early Literacy and 1 st -5 th graders have been taking the STAR assessment in both reading and math. These assessments provide important data for each student which we use to better address individual learning needs. Students are only compared to themselves to measure progress throughout the year. STAR testing will take place again during the winter and spring quarters. Note: Forward Test results were sent home to those who participated last spring.

We will welcome grandparents to NCES: St. Mark on Friday, October 20 from 12:45to 2:00. We will begin with a brief prayer service and following that, students and grandparents will play BINGO. We look forward to this wonderful time of sharing and fun. More information to follow.

As we make our way through the busy days of October, note that there is no school for Newman on October 26 th as the teachers have in-service. Everyone is off on October 27 th . We look forward to our Halloween Parade, on October 31 st . A Constant Contact will go out asking for prize donations for the students. And while Halloween is a fun time for children, we also remember that All-Saints Day, on November 1, is an important celebration in our Catholic faith. May God always keep our children safe and bring us together in prayer.

4K

The 4K students have enjoyed learning about the different seasons of the year and we have been discussing what happens when fall turns into summer. Some of our big ideas for October will be Apples, pumpkins and trees.

Social Skills: We continue to go over rules and expectations in the classroom and we are going to start learning some self control strategies, and learning social stories.

Literacy: We have started introducing the concept that each letter has a sound and we have started making our way through the alphabet. We have started working on recognizing our own name and putting the letters together to make our name. We continue to work on book and print concepts (cover, title, author). We will start talking about different types of books.

Math: We continue to work on counting and will focus on rote counting to 10. We will also start trying to match 2 identical shapes and discuss different characteristics of shapes.

Science: We are going to work on observing what happens outside when fall changes start to occur. In the classroom we will be experimenting with magnets.

We are working on reading and writing short vowel words. We have been practicing how to blend sounds to help us with our reading and writing. In math we will continue to work on addition strategies and begin learning subtraction strategies. Living and nonliving things will continue to be taught in October.

In social studies we talked about being good citizens and will be learning about rules and laws and why we have them. For religion we will learn that Jesus worked among the people and how He wants us to help others like he did.

The first graders will continue to learn to the best of their abilities, laugh, have fun, and be proud of their hard work!



Second Grade News

Wow!! We have already completed one month of school!! Where does the time go? The students have been having a lot of fun using the SMART Board to do reading, phonics, and math activities for review and reinforcement.

In our Wonders reading we have learned about how our families are the same and different and how we depend on our friends. In the coming weeks we will learn about how families work together. We are becoming familiar with our new reading series and enjoying the stories we have been reading. Continue to have your child read every night to reinforce fluency and comprehension skills.

In math we will continue to review our addition and subtraction facts and learn strategies to help with our facts. Please have your child work on basic math facts at home.

In science we will be studying the Earth. We will learn about the Earth today and long ago. We will explore what the Earth was like when the dinosaurs lived on Earth and how it compares to our Earth today. In English the students will be learning to identify different kinds of sentences and identifying the subject and predicate of a sentence.

I look forward to a great year with all the students.

Third Grade News

We are off to such a wonderful start and have already learned so much in the third grade!

In math, we are moving into applying our knowledge of place value to addition and subtraction within 1,000. This month, they will learn about the commutative, associative, and identity properties of addition/subtraction. They will also explore estimation to check the reasonableness of answers, analyze the relationship between addition and subtraction, and master the addition/subtraction of numbers to three digits.

In reading, we have been focusing on understanding story elements and reading for literary experience. The students have truly enjoyed the stories in our reading book and we are having some amazing in-depth discussions about them! Please continue to have your child study their spelling words.

In Religion, we are growing as disciples of Jesus! Our focus this month is following the example of the Apostles and our other ancestors in faith in leaving lives of service and holiness. The virtue that we will be focusing on this month is reverence - showing our deepest respect for God and the things of God.

I look forward to watching your third graders grow in both their academic and faith journey throughout the year! God bless!

Fourth Grade News

The month of September has passed by quickly as we have been busy praying and learning together. Students had a great start to the new school year. They found themselves exploring new classrooms, learning their teacher's expectations, and reconnecting with friends. It is very gratifying to see students step up to the added

responsibility in such a short time.

Our first unit in religion will help students follow Jesus by learning about the beatitudes and how to live them. They will also learn about their conscience and the way it helps them to make good choices and bring them closer to God.

Yes, we will be using our carrying and borrowing skills. Students will use the properties of addition and subtraction to help them find sums and differences.

In Social Studies we are looking at the geography of the United States and where Wisconsin fits in. Students used reference points, longitude and latitude lines, direction, size, shape, and scale to locate positions of Wisconsin in relation to the Earth's surface. Our next chapter has us on a journey to early Wisconsin History. We will explore the regions of our state and the earliest people to live in Wisconsin

It is hard to believe that we are already one month into the school year, time sure flies!

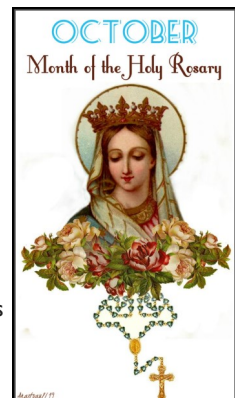

During our math lessons we have focused on whole numbers up to the billions, and started working with decimal numbers to the thousandths. As we move into October, students will continue to study decimal numbers. We will also start working with multiplication and division.

Spanish News

¡Hola! Throughout September, students in grades 1-5 have been reviewing the Spanish they already know. **First graders** have been reviewing colors and animals while we work with the story ¿Oso pardo, oso pardo qué ves ahí? (Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See?) **Second grade** has been reviewing the days and months and is beginning to talk about weather and seasons. This is leading up to the story, Froggy Se Viste (Froggy Gets Dressed). **Third graders** have been learning about Monarch butterflies and their migration to Mexico for the winter and then back to the U.S. and Canada in spring. We will be sending paper butterflies to a school in Mexico and then new butterflies will be returned to us in spring. **Fourth graders** are talking about their families: how many members there are, who the members are, how old they are, etc. **Fifth graders** are using all of their prior Spanish knowledge to read a story about a mouse family who scares off a cat in the park by speaking 'dog'!

Kindergarteners are new to Spanish. We have class once a week for twenty minutes. We have been learning to sing the "Buenas Dias" (Good morning) song, and with that how to ask and tell how we are. We are also learning our numbers and some action verbs.

Following the American Council of Foreign Language, which recommends 90% plus of world language classes, at all levels, be conducted in the target language, all our classes are taught mostly in Spanish. Students understand by listening for cognates (words that sound like English words) and by looking at pictures and body language. Students must be active listeners during Spanish class. Please reassure your student, they do not need to understand every word. Listen for the overall gist of what is said and trust that you do understand!!

We have been having a blast in Physical Education Class this past month. Your children in 1-3 grade worked on their soccer skills and in Kindergarten we worked on spatial awareness, locomotor skills, and soccer. Fourth and fifth grade had some fitness testing to complete as well as worked on their soccer skills. We were able to be outside for a lot of the month thanks to the wonderful Wisconsin weather. During the month of October grades 1-5 will be having fun learning and playing flag football and then we will begin working on our tennis skills for grades 1-5. Art News

Students are happy to be back in the Art room to enjoy hands on creative artwork time.

Kindergarten has been reviewing shapes and learned that we can change shapes; a circle into an oval or even longer, a square into a rectangle, and triangles can be tall and wide. Students drew shapes connecting to more shapes, creating 'somethings' by wherever their imagination took them. **1st graders** are using varieties of lines to fill in a large leaf shape which makes "Design". This is a new word for them. Crayons and watercolor will make this project beautiful. **2nd grade** just completed an eye catching Sunflower with a deep blue background to make it stand out. We are enjoying them in the hallway. And now onto Color

Wheel lessons where students learned to mix the right proportions of colors to make the "in betweens" such as yellow green or red orange. Ask your child if they can list the 'Primary colors' and the 'Secondary colors'. **3rd grade** has begun a Bee drawing which also gave way to discussion on how important bees are to growing our food. We should learn about which bee's sting so we leave them alone and which bees are great pollinators so we can help them by adding plants they love. **4th grade** has been working on 'lettering', using their name. Early marks were the beginning of communication, and to this day artistic 'marks/lines' etc. are still a way to communicate beyond words. Lettering itself can be an art form. Next we are making raised creative lines of glue inside of a leaf shape. This lesson develops fine motor (finger) skills, mental focus and creative design. We will finish it off with watercolor. **5th graders** have been developing their watercolor/ blending skills and reviewing the color wheel by painting a spiral starting with one color and slowly blending in the next color

Ex: red, red orange, orange, yellow orange and so on. We will top it off with metallic marker designs over the painting.

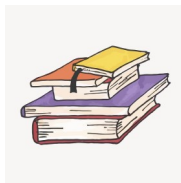

Bullying is: hurting someone with words or actions over and over on purpose. 4 Types of Bullying are:

Physical

- hitting
- kicking
- tripping
- pinching and pushing
- damaging property

Verbal

- name-calling
- insults
- teasing
- intimidation

Social and Emotional Also called "relational bullying", includes behaviors designed to

- harm a child's reputation or cause humiliation
- lying and spreading rumors
- playing mean jokes to embarrass someone
- mimicking the child in a mean way
- encouraging social exclusion of a child

Cyber-bullying

- taunting or humiliation through social media sites (Facebook, Twitter, etc.) or the Internet
- humiliating others while playing online games
- verbal or emotional bullying through chat rooms, instant message or texting

October is National Bullying Prevention month. Throughout the month, Mrs. Clermont will be visiting all the classrooms to talk about what bullying is. At the left is the definition provided to students.

Ways to help those who are bullied:

1. Ask a trusted adult for help
2. Be a good friend
3. Set a good example with your words and actions
4. Respect other's differences
5. Don't give bullying an audience

Activities to do at home:

Discuss: The 4 types of bullying (at left) and what they could look like

Ask: Who is a trusted adult at school your student could go to if they are bullied or witness bullying to ask for help?

Share: Ways to stand up for others who are being bullied

Discuss: Ways to include others in games and activities at home and at school

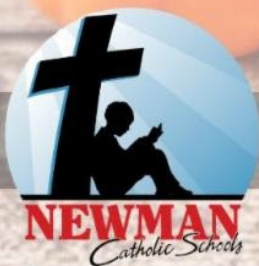
