Dear Parent/Guardian,

Treutlen Elementary School, students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, agree that this compact outlines how the parents, the entire school staff, and the students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement as well as describes how the school and parents will build and develop a partnership that will help children achieve the State's high standards.

The parents, students, and staff of Treutlen Elementary School partnered together to develop this school-parent compact as a commitment to supporting the academic achievement of all students. Teachers suggested ways parents can support their child's learning at home. Parent input included how the school can support them as they help them meet their child's academic learning goals. Parents are encouraged to attend annual revision meetings held during the month of August and September each year to review the compact and make suggestions based on student needs and school improvement goals. Parents are also encouraged to participate in the Annual Title I parent survey that is also used as a tool to collect parent feedback regarding the current Title I programs and policies.

District and School Academic Goals

As a schoolwide program the overarching goal is to improve the entire educational program in all schools which should result in improving the academic achievement of all students, particularly the lowest achieving students.

The district mission is "To Engage, Equip, and Inspire All for Success in Life" .

Treutlen County School System Goals:

By the end of the 2023-2024 school year:

- Treutlen County will demonstrate a 5% increase in the percentage of students scoring at or above the 50% in math on the NWEA-MAP
- Treutlen County will demonstrate a 5% increase in the percentage of students scoring at or above the 50% in reading on the NWEA - MAP
- The number of students scoring at the proficient/distinguished level in science & social studies will increase by 3% from the prior year (2022 - 2023).
- Treutlen County Schools will demonstrate a 3% increase in the number of students absent less than 10% of enrolled days.

Treutlen Elementary School Goals/Academic Focus:

TES staff members have studied our student performance data to decide on our most important areas of improvement for our school and align with district goals:

- By the end of the 2023-24 school year, student achievement will Increase in ELA as evidenced by the percentage of students increasing from 61% to 64% scoring at or above the 50th percentile



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on the NWEA MAP in Reading and a 5% increase in students scoring 3 and 4s in Reading on the GMAS

- By the end of the 2023-24 school year, student achievement will Increase in Math as evidenced the percentage of students increasing from 60% to 63% scoring at or above the 50th percentile on the NWEA MAP in Math and a 5% increase in students scoring 3 and 4s in Math on the GMAS.
- By the end of the 2023-24 school year the percentage of 5th grade students scoring at the proficient and distinguished learner level in Science will increase from 27% to 30% by May 2024, as measured on the Georgia Milestones State Assessment.
- By the end of the 2023-24 school year, culture and climate of TES will improve as evidenced by increased attendance, student engagement, and decreased office referrals measured by:
 - a. A 10% decrease in students missing 10% of the school year or more.
 - b. An increase in the number of classrooms exhibiting student engagement through observation as measured by the TES engagement observation rubric.
 - c. A decrease of 10% in office discipline referrals from the previous year as recorded through SWIS.
