




2023 Profile

The Community

Mason and Deerfield Township, communities of 70,000 residents 25 miles northeast of Cincinnati, continue to be a destination for diverse, college-educated professionals seeking a close-knit, forward-thinking home. Great schools, quality neighborhoods, and responsive government services make the area a prime location for raising a family and educating children.

The District

As a high-performing public school district nationally recognized for innovation and inclusion, Mason City Schools ensures that each of its 10,400 students is academically prepared and prepared for life. William Mason High School develops self-navigating learners, leaders and citizens through expansive programming opportunities, which include 26 AP courses, a student-run bank and store, a student-produced broadcast network, a robust student-run experiential learning program that includes community service, over 70 sanctioned extracurricular clubs and activities, 67 athletic teams, and nationally recognized performing arts programs. Mason City Schools is proud to partner with Great Oaks Institute of Technology and Career Development, which provides career education opportunities for students.

COVID-19 Impact

During the Spring of 2020, our school was remote for the fourth quarter with all instruction delivered remotely by MHS teachers and no in-person extracurricular activities were offered. During the 2020-21 school year, 13% of MHS students and families chose the completely remote online learning option supported by MHS teachers. Online curriculum providers were used to supplement and support online learners in all core academic subjects, and most AP, honors, and elective courses that were available to in-person learners. 87% of students and families chose the completely in-person learning option for the entire school year. Our students earned traditional letter grades throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.

New Grade-Point Average Calculation for the Class of 2023 and Beyond Class of 2024

In 2019, William Mason High School adopted a new 4.0 weighted grade-point average calculation scale (see the chart under *New Grade-Point Average Calculation* section of profile). The grade-point averages displayed on the Class of 2024 student transcripts are calculated based upon this new 4.0 weighted scale.


