Lake County High Schools Technology Campus: Offered to students in their junior and senior year, this program allows Round Lake students to attend classes at the "Tech Campus" in a career specific training program. Students can become certified in various concentrations, as well as earn both high school and college credit through the College of Lake County simultaneously. Programs Round Lake students participate in include, but are not limited to, Automotive Service, Certified Nursing Assistant, Culinary Arts, Emergency Medical Services, and Cosmetology.

Schuler Scholar Program: The Schuler Scholar Program, through enrichment, academic programs, guidance, and scholarship prepares high potential students to succeed at selective colleges. The rigorous selection process identifies students that are dedicated to exceeding academically through high standard eligibility requirements. The goal of this process is to select high achieving students who need additional guidance and preparation to gain access to and graduate from selective colleges and universities.

Standards-Based Grading:

Each class is broken up into a group of Power Standards, Standards, and Indicators. Power Standards and Standards identify the concepts and skills students are expected to master to complete the course successfully. Indicators define what it looks like to master the standard to which they are attached. **Students are assessed and provided feedback at the Indicator level.** Generally, each indicator is evaluated multiple times throughout the school year in order to get the best measure of your learning. Each grade entered on a standard is meant to be an indication of mastery of the concept or skill at that moment in time.

In standards-based grading, the grade calculation is more complex than in traditional grading. However, the grade assigned is a far better representation of student learning than under traditional grading practices. It is no longer a simple matter of adding up all of a student's "points" out of the total points possible and dividing by the number of assignments. **In fact, with standards-based grading, students no longer receive "points."** Rather, in standards-based grading, a student's performance on concepts and skills is evaluated based on a rubric, which describes the required performance level, and is then assigned a categorical rating based on that performance. Consequently, earning a few more "points" here or there will not assist a student in "passing" the course. **On average, students must perform at least at the "Basic" level (category 2) or better on every power standard and standard in order to be assured of passing the course.**
