

Washington State College Admission Standards

English	4	
Mathematics	3 credits +	During senior year, students must earn 1 credit in a math- based course. An algebra-based science course taken during senior year would also satisfy this requirement
Science	3 credits	2 credits must be laboratory science
World Languages	2 credits	Credits must be earned in same language
Social Sciences	3 credits	0.5 credits of Civics credit required; 0.5 credit of Washington state history is required if not earned prior to high school
Arts	2 credits	2 credits of fine, visual, or performing arts

^{*}A senior year math-based quantitative course is required. This can be met by:

- taking a math class during senior year
- taking an algebra-based science class during senior year
- completing Pre-Calculus by junior year





1. Take a Career Quiz. Get Personalized Career Recommendations.


Students can take a 10-minute career quiz about their interests and get matched to a list of 30 potential careers to explore.

FAQs

How can I see upcoming events, school holidays, and daily schedules?

Will students have the same counselors throughout high school?

Ideally, yes. This is to help develop a better connection between student and counselors as students progress through high school.

Where can I find the most up-to-date grades for my student?

The best place to find up-to-date grades for your student is on PowerSchool.

FAQs

What are the library hours this year?

The library will be open from 7:30am – 5pm, Monday-Friday.

What is a fitness waiver?

Students need to take three semesters of PE class to graduate high school. Students can earn one semester of PE credit if they participate in one season of KCHS athletics. This can only be applied for one season each academic year, regardless of how many seasons in which a student participates. Students cannot waive Intro. to PE and they cannot waive Intro. to Health. This information will be added to transcripts at the end of each season, so long as students complete the sports season.

For non-KCHS athletics and activities, students must obtain permission from the PE/Health Department Chair and the Academic Office.

If the activity is deemed eligible, students will need to obtain a waiver form from our school registrar, Mrs. Eztkorn.
