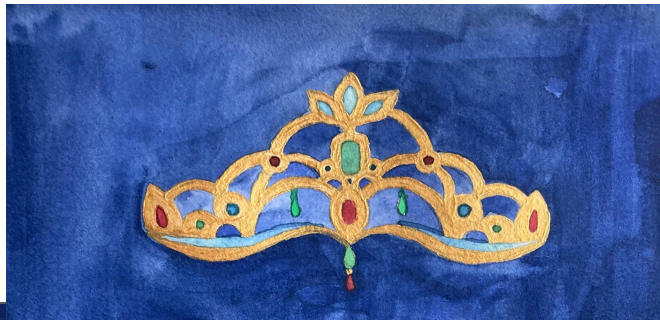

Midwives → Moses' sister Miriam →
Exodus from Egypt → Leviticus →
Numbers → Deuteronomy → Joshua
→ Judges



Brief History

- The Book of Judges begins with Joshua's death
- Israel began worshipping false gods, which aroused God's anger
- Exodus 20:2-17

- Chapter 4 = Narrative
- Chapter 5 = Poetry

Name means “Bee” or “Woman of the Word”

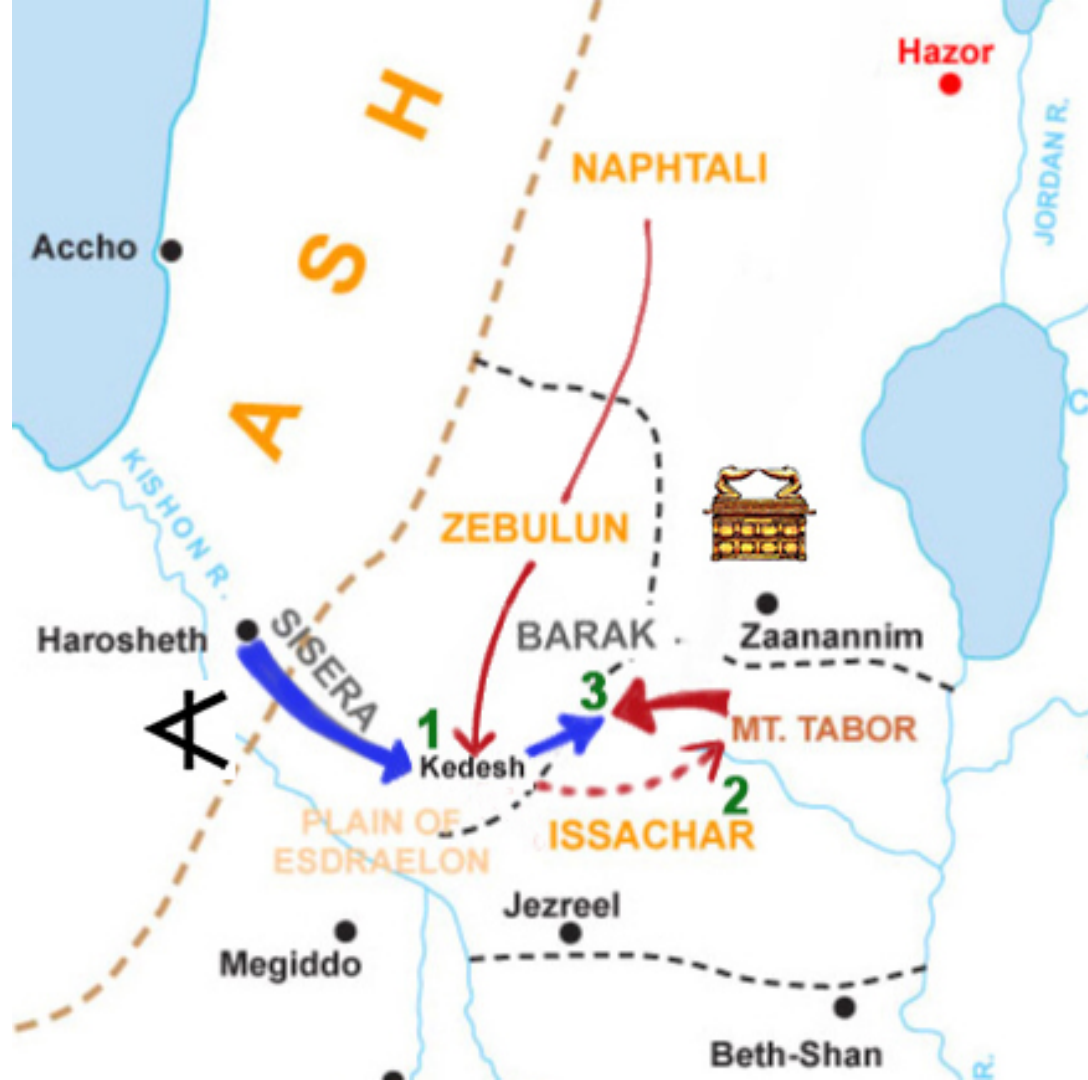
- Judge and Prophet

Lessons from Judges Chapter 4

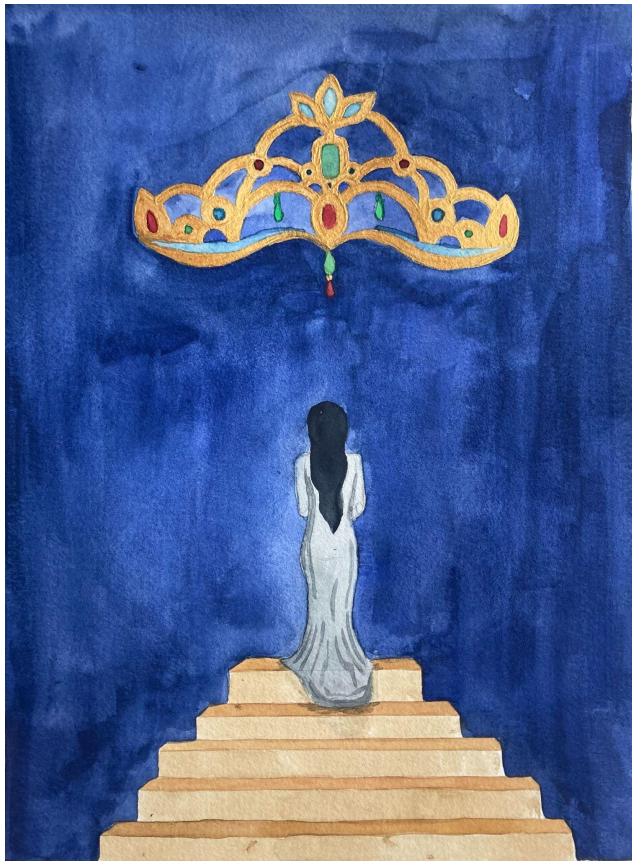
- Overcome fear
