Our School

Since 1964, Henry M. Gunn High School has been a model of rigorous and innovative learning. Gunn's mission is to foster a community of creative thinkers who: will acquire knowledge, skills, values, and integrity; be resilient, responsible, respectful, contributing citizens; and lead rewarding lives which pursue personal excellence and lifelong learning. Gunn has been ranked #23 in "Best High Schools in California" by the school ranking platform, U.S. News. Gunn is located in Palo Alto, California, 35 miles south of San Francisco and 14 miles north of San Jose in Santa Clara County. Palo Alto is a community of approximately 69,406 residents.

Our Community: Impact of COVID-19

The high school closed March 17, 2020 due to health concerns stemming from the pandemic. Students were graded using Credit/No Credit (C/NC) scale for Semester 2 in the 2019-2020 school year.

<u>California Assembly Bill 104</u> allowed parents to request an A-D letter grade earned in any course during the 2020-2021 school year to be changed to Pass (P) and any F grade to No Pass (NP).



SELF is a non-graded 4-year comprehensive weekly program for every Gunn student participates in weekly. As students develop the core SEL competencies – social awareness, self-management, self-efficacy, self-awareness, social management, and social engagement – students build community and share stories with a trusted adult mentor and each other, guided by specific themes each semester like equity and empathy, self-identity, and building relationships.

Alternative Programs

Gunn offers several alternative programs such as AVID, Social Justice Pathway, College Pathway (first-generation students), Business Pathway, Foothill Middle College, and College Now. Also, there are several Dual Enrollment programs that include Sports Medicine, Stage Tech, and Multivariable Calculus.
