Dear Bellevue Union School District Families and Staff,

#### State of the District

Summer Programming: We are currently planning what we believe will be an outstanding summer learning academy for our students. This summer we will offer two sessions, one at the beginning of the summer and one at the end. Additionally, we will partner with the Napa County Office of Education's Cool School team to complement our morning academic sessions with afternoon enrichment activities. We will provide bussing from each of the school sites to Bellevue Elementary, where the summer academy will be held, to ensure equitable access for all BUSD students.

The BUSD Experience: Over the summer, we will be working on a district document currently entitled the, "BUSD Student Experience." The purpose of this document is to lay out a plan for developing a common set of experiences that all BUSD students will receive regardless of the school they attend. At this time, we are focusing on the following categories: Art and Music; Sports; Experiential Learning (Field Trips); Before/After School and Break Enrichment. Once complete, this document will spell out in detail those "common" experiences that all BUSD students will receive from Transitional Kindergarten through Grade 6 and it will allow us to properly allocate resources in our budget to support the funding of these experiences.

In closing, we are looking forward to what lies ahead as we close out the school year in a positive way. Students will soon begin their annual state testing where they will have the opportunity to demonstrate their acquired knowledge from this year's learning. We will also be holding community engagement events at each of the school sites with the biggest event being Open House. Bellevue and Meadow View will host their Open House Nights on May 10th while Kawana Springs and Taylor Mountain will open their doors to families on May 17th. Additionally, we will hold our first BUSD End of Year Celebration for staff on May 24th so that we can honor the hard work and achievements of our BUSD staff and conclude our school year just like we started it, together.

## **DISTRICT UPDATES:**

## Business Service: Chris Kim, CBO (business@busd.org)

The District presented the audit of its financial statements and governmental activities associated with Measure C and Measure J for the 2021/22 fiscal year by Christy White and Associates. In summary, the audit identified no findings or questioned costs for the year ended on June 30, 2022 for both Measure C and Measure J.

The District also seated two members on its Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee related to the General Obligation Bond, Election of 2020, Measure C. These appointees were approved by the Board of Trustees and all associated review of facilities expenditures, bylaws, and audits were likewise completed.

The State of California's Revision to the FY 2023-24 budget takes place in May. Following this, the District will update its financial assumptions for the FY 2023-24 fiscal year with particular attention to the statutory cost of living adjustment (COLA). These updated budgetary assumptions will be mirrored in the District's Budget and LCAP proposals.

#### **Testing**

Our 5th grade students have started to take the California Physical Fitness Test (PFT) and the California Science Test (CAST). Students in grades 3-6 will take the Smarter Balanced Summative Assessment in English Language Arts and Math beginning in May. Our 3-6 grade Kawana Springs students will also take the California Spanish Assessment.

- Make sure your child is here. Get to school on time to allow your child to feel relaxed and unrushed. More than ever, being on time is critical to successful testing experiences.


# Student Services: Tracy Whitaker (<u>studentservices@busd.org</u>)
