School Districts are required to file two reports during the fiscal year (interim reports) on the status of the District's financial health. The District's Second Interim Report was presented on March 7, 2023 to the Board of Trustees which included budgetary adjustments made through February 28, 2023.

This report took into account updated revenue and expenditure assumptions with an emphasis on updates to the Local Control Funding Formula, State and Federal Revenue, and projected District Reserves.

The District's current and prior year financial statements, past audits, and associated reports and presentations may be found on the District website under Fiscal Reports.

ELPAC Testing

If your child speaks a language other than English at home and is identified as an English learner (multilingual student), he/she will be taking the *English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC)*.

Beginning this month, Bellevue Union School District (BUSD) will start to give this test to all English learners.



The ELPAC consists of two separate English Language

Proficiency (ELP) assessments: one for the initial identification of students as English learners and the other for the annual summative assessment to identify students' English language proficiency level and to measure their progress in learning English. The initial assessment is given within a student's first 30 days at Bellevue Union School District. This test helps identify students who are not fully fluent in English and may need additional support to access the full/core curriculum. Students who are not fully proficient in English will receive instructional support to help develop their English. This support is called English Language Development (ELD).

The Summative ELPAC assessment is given annually in the spring to students with the designation of English learner. The ELPAC measures student progress in learning English, and helps determine if students need additional support in language learning or if they are ready to be reclassified as English proficient, which is the goal for all students identified as English learners.

English learners throughout the state of California *only get one opportunity per year* to demonstrate their proficiency in these four areas in the Summative ELPAC:

Listening

- Speaking
- Reading
- Writing

The goal is for students to receive an **Overall Level 4 on the Summative ELPAC**, which deems the students as proficient in English. BUSD's goal is to reclassify all of our English learners prior to their promotion from our district. We recognize that supporting our students' English language development and proficiency will ultimately help them to experience greater opportunities and success in middle school, high school, and beyond.

Pineapple Paletas (serves 8) 5 MINUTES PREP + 6 HOURS FREEZE TIME



Ingredients

- 1 can (20 oz.) pineapple tidbits, chunks, or slices in water or 100% juice, not drained
- 2 Tbsp. fresh lime juice (about 1 large lime)
- Pour contents of pineapple can and lime juice into a blender or food processor. Pulse until pulpy but not smooth.
- Fill popsicle molds (or small paper cups) and insert popsicle sticks.
- Freeze at least 6 hours or overnight. To loosen pops from molds, run warm water over outside of mold. Gently wiggle sticks and pull.
