# Parents and guardians will work together with the whole ISK community for the betterment of it by:

- Assuming the best in all interactions with ISK staff, students, and community members.
- Engaging with your child's ISK experience.
- Support teachers and staff to make the ISK community successful.
- Supporting other parents and students through actions and words.
- Modeling the mission and vision
- Voting in elections put forth by the Board of Directors
- Being a member of the Parent Teacher Association (PTA) or the PTA Executive Committee
- Standing for election or appointment to be a member of the ISKR Board of Directors
- Attending Annual General Meetings
- Approving the annual budget & changes to school policy & statutes in AGM

# **Compassionate**

# Parents will assist the school with creating a safe and healthy environment by:

- Reinforcing with children the need to respect people, property, safety, and the rights of others, particularly in line with the ISK Community Agreement
- Showing respect and empathy towards all staff of ISK, including teachers, business office staff, and cleaners and guards.
- Sending your child to school well prepared to learn, wellrested, well-nourished, properly groomed, and appropriately dressed for school activities with all materials needed for classroom and extracurricular success.
- Ensuring that your child is properly supervised if and when parents are away from home. The Temporary Guardianship Form, found here outlines these responsibilities
- Respecting the health of others by keeping children at home if they are unwell, especially communicable illnesses
- Promoting and modeling positive communication on campus with security and household staff members



### **Inclusive**

#### Parents and guardians will support a secure, and safe learning community for ISK by fostering:

- An environment where cultural, religious and social diversity is celebrated and respectful communication is valued.
- An environment where those with additional needs are respected and included. They are not treated differently or isolated.
- An environment that is free of intimidation, harassment, and physical, sexual, or verbal abuse
- An environment that is holistic in nature, focused on the whole child.

## **Engaged**

#### Parents will support their child and the ISK community by:

- During instructional time, all parents and visitors should report to the school office on campus for any meetings or requests.
- Reading, understanding, and signing ISK's child protection policy and reinforcing these ideas with household staff and drivers.
- · Volunteering at the school when able.
- Reading division handbooks carefully and asking for clarification if needed
- Maintaining contact with teachers as necessary: bring concerns directly to the appropriate teacher for clarification or
  resolution before approaching the director or the board. Teachers will respond within 3 working days.
- Disclosing appropriate information regarding illnesses and medication via the health form found here.
- Providing the school with up-to-date contact information, and keeping such information current, in case of emergency
- Attending meetings and workshops (such as Back to School Night) related to your child's development and learning
- Supervising your child's Internet use to ensure age-appropriate content and online safety at home. Guidance is <a href="here-from-common-sense-media">here-from-common-sense-media</a>.
- Collecting students by 3:10 pm Monday Thursday or 1:10 pm Friday when students are not involved in an afterschool activity, or by the end of their activity at 4:00 pm
- Inform your child's class teacher (EC/Elementary) or Secondary School Advisor of any new circumstances that may affect
  your child's learning or well-being
- Contact the Counselor or Learning Support Specialist regarding any potential learning difficulties or significant socialemotional needs
- Reading ISK communications to keep updated on what is happening at school
- Adhering to ISK policies (as outlined in each divisional handbook)
- Ensuring that students attend school regularly and without extended vacations; informing the school of any time when the
  family needs to be away by requesting an extended absence.
- · Helping to foster student pride, confidence, and a positive attitude in school and teachers
