Honors and AP courses are available to students 9th through 12th grade. Community service and character education are an integral part of UA curriculum. # DUAL ENROLLMENT

Students in 11th and 12th grade may participate in the NC Career and College Promise (CCP) Dual Enrollment Program with South Piedmont Community College (SPCC).

# **GRADING SYSTEM**

Students receive numeric grades on a 100-point scale for each course. Grade Point Averages (GPA) are calculated on a 4.0 scale converted from numeric grades. Honors courses receive a .5 extra quality point toward GPA. AP Courses and CCP Dual Enrollment courses receive 1 extra quality point in GPA calculations. Class rank is computed at the end of the 1st semester and again at the end of the year.
