

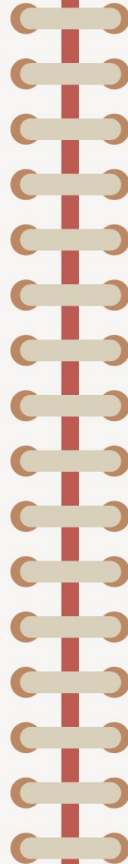


## Professional Development for Intervention

- **Grades K-2 Math for All Workshops:** Neurodevelopmental theory to analyze the strengths and challenges of students
  - **Math in Focus consultant helping K-5** teachers design math lessons with a focus on differentiation strategies, monthly meetings
  - **Wilson Reading** training for Kindergarten
  - In-house workshop for **Paraprofessionals and In-Class Support strategies for intervention**
  - **Self-regulation Intervention** Workshop for Special Educators
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## What is Differentiated Instruction

- Differentiated Instruction is a teacher's response to learner's needs
- Guided by general principles of differentiation
- Teachers can differentiate the content, the process, or the product
- Based on student's readiness, interests, or learning profile
- A differentiated classroom is flexible and responsive to on-going assessment of needs



There are a range of instructional strategies teachers can implement, like:

- Tailoring an assignment for different levels of learning (tiered lessons)
- Offer assignment options, with teacher guidance
- Offering different paces for learning new material
- Flexible grouping
- Using supplemental materials or hint cards
- Cohorting students with like skills
- Choosing problems/activities that have a "low floor but a high ceiling"
- Using learning stations
- Offering problems/activities with many solutions or many strategies to get to the solution
