Meet the author of Lights! Camera! College! In order to help students navigate the college application process, Torria Buckley, district graduation coach, is offering special help for seniors during College Go Week Sept. 25-29.

"College Go Week is where most Indiana schools waive the application fee for students," Buckley said. She says the goal is to help seniors navigate the college admissions process to ensure each student submits at least one admissions application. Thirty-three Indiana colleges and universities are participating this year.

To encourage student participation, Buckley has planned events for every day of the week, which include author meet and greets to college trivia to essay writing assistance.

"I think it gives students a better opportunity to apply," senior Griffen Geer said. "It pulls students in and gets their attention. It gives students a chance to apply to schools they maybe would not have thought of."

Along with the activities, Buckley will also sit down with students and help them fill out college applications. Senior Ralph Cooke, III has already filled out a college application to Ball State using the Common App, but plans on still participating in the events.

Cooke said, "I don't know what to think about college; yet, I do want to go to experience it." Cooke does not have more than one college option, not even a backup college. He currently has no scholarships. For students like Cooke, not having an application fee helps him, since fees range from \$35 to even \$100. For example, Indiana University's admission fee is \$65.

Many seniors plan on taking advantage of any event they can senior year.

"It's good for the seniors because it's their last year," senior Ernest Wesley said. "It gives me more of a social life going to these events that Mrs. Buckley plans."

Wesley said that he will take advantage of the College Go Week activities, especially applying to more colleges. "If it's free, why not," he said.
