#### **WELCOME TO OUR 2023-2024 OCTOBER NEWSLETTER!**

ATTENTION FWCS SENIORS! As you may or may not know, there are major changes and improvements being made to the 2024-2025 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form. SENIORS will be able to complete the FAFSA application beginning December.

Indiana now requires ALL seniors to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The requirement was approved both by the Indiana Senate and House and signed by Governor Eric Holcomb. While you are waiting for the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form to launch, ALL seniors and parents or guardians of seniors should create their account (FSA ID). "An FSA ID consists of a username and password you create to gain access to the U.S. Department of Education's online systems. An FSA ID can also serve as your legal signature when completing electronic documents. While you are not required to have an FSA ID to complete and submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) form, it is the fastest way to sign your application and have it processed. It is also the only way to access or correct your information online, or to prefill a FAFSA form with information from your previous year's FAFSA form. You must keep your FSA ID secure and never share it with anyone" (Department of Education, 2023).

During the next several months, high school guidance counselors, GEAR UP Student Advisors, and the College and Career Readiness staff will work closely with students and their families to create FSA ID's and complete the FAFSA.







### Help students graduate college with less debt.

Questa Education Foundation is a non-profit organization that serves the 11-county region of Northeast Indiana. Questa provides unique funding opportunities to help students from our area pursue further education after high school. Below are a few funding opportunities that could be a great resource for the students you mentor:

- Questa Traditional Scholars program: Students graduating high school can apply for up to \$20,000 of funding to pursue a certificate, associate, or bachelor's degree.
   Funding is a loan that is up to 75% forgiven\* when students graduate from a partner school and return to northeast Indiana to live and work for five years after graduation.
   Applications are open December 1 March 15.
- Parkview Opportunity Scholars program: Students graduating from FWCS can apply for up to \$10,000 in funding to pursue an associate degree at Ivy Tech. Funding is a loan that is 100% forgiven when students graduate and start their careers at Parkview Health (students receive full debt forgiveness when they work at Parkview for one year). Students are encouraged to apply by March 1, but applications will be accepted until all awards are made.
- MadeByMe Scholarship: Students pursuing training or certificate in the skilled trades can receive up to \$1,000 in scholarship funding to help with any related training expenses (including mileage, equipment, and training fees). Application open until all awards are made.
- Scholarship Search Tool: Questa hosts a database of local scholarship opportunities to help students find additional funding for training or college expenses. Visit www. questafoundation.org/scholarship-database to access our robust list of resources.

Questa Partner Schools: Anderson University, Grace College, Huntington University, Indiana Tech, Ivy Tech Community College Fort Wayne & Warsaw, Indiana Wesleyan University, Manchester University, Purdue University Fort Wayne, Taylor University, Trine University, and University of Saint Francis

\*Loan forgiveness options may vary. 50% of our loan is forgiven when a scholar lives and works in Northeast Indiana for five years after graduation. An additional 25% may be forgiven when a scholar graduates from one of our partner schools.
