Message from Mr. Johnson

October is here!

It is a wonderful time of the year! The leaves are starting to change, the temperatures are cooling off, and the school year is well on its way. As we enjoy all the things Fall has to offer, it is a great time to enjoy family and friend time.

We are nearing the end of the first quarter at school. This is a great time to reflect on the start of the school year and how our students are progressing. If you are like me, it is also a great time as a parent to think about the progress of my children and how they are developing into all that I want them to be as an adult. We desire for our children to build a strong foundation that will serve them well in their careers. This foundation is built on certain traits that are needed to succeed. Traits like Independence and Networking, Problem-Solving and Self-Advocacy. We also want our children to present and speak well when needed. These are many of the traits we are trying to build through Project-Based Learning here at Falls Lake Academy.

As I have said before, we are only successful with the help of our family unit. This help is needed in each and every Firebird home. If we are working to build these traits, and you are at home as well, we will make the most impact on every child. I want to encourage you as a parent to communicate regularly with your child's teacher, know what is going on with his/her grades, encourage homework and make time for device-free family time. One thing we changed this year was no homework over the weekend or tests on Mondays. This was intended to help give you more time to devote to your family unit. Please use that! I encourage you to restrict your child's time on their devices (ie:phone, computer, ipad). Too much device time allows the child's focus to be on so many other things besides academics or learning. Don't get me wrong- It can be useful at times, but when we allow unlimited use and unmanaged time, students will fall to the temptation and stray away from academic work most of the time. From what we see daily here, devices are involved in some way in more than 80% of our behavior incidents. When students come to school and are required to put devices away for class, there is also a hesitation and/or slight defiance because this is not something they are used too. Help us help our students. This is what will be required when they enter their careers.

Lastly, give your child so much encouragement. Let your child struggle with answers at times and don't just tell him/her the answers. Encourage them through it. Be their biggest cheerleader but be careful not to remove all their academic struggles. These struggles force them to find answers, discover resources, and discover solutions to problems. These are all valuable skills for your student to develop as they grow into successful adults. Ask your students questions to help them think like: How are you going to find the answer? What resources can you use to get help? Why do you think this is the answer and not something else? Questions like this force students to think and come up with a reason for their answer. This builds inquiry and stamina to find out answers to things they don't know. We are seeing this as a weakness for a large number of our high school students. Use this time together and make it fun! If we set time aside in our schedules and just commit to spending time with the most important things in our lives- OUR CHILDREN- then we will receive the biggest blessings. This time spent together also allows you to model good behaviors and show them how they can be respectful and nice to others. If you are not being the teacher at home, then I am afraid your child's device will. Please, please, please don't miss out on this opportunity while you have it.
