Social Studies Skills and Processes

Reading and Source Analysis and Application

- Read closely to determine what the text says explicitly and to make logical inferences from it.
- Integrate and evaluate content presented graphically, visually, orally, and multimodally as well as in words within and across print and digital sources.
- Evaluate the argument and specific claims in a text, including the validity of the reasoning as well as the relevance and fluency of the evidence.

Writing Standards

- Students will write arguments focused on discipline-specific content.
- Students will write informative/ explanatory texts, including the narration of historical events.

Historical Thinking and Reasoning

- Engage in inquiry, including constructing compelling questions, supporting questions, and determining helpful resources needed to answer their questions.
- Evaluate context, continuity and change by analyzing connections among events and developments in broader historical contexts.
- Analyze various perspectives by analyzing the multiple factors that influenced peoples' perspectives during different historical eras and explaining how and why perspectives change over time.
- Analyze the relative influence of various causes of events and developments in the past and in contemporary society while evaluating their effects and implications.

7th Grade Course Content

Unit One: Medieval Europe

- Analyze how the geography of Europe influenced the ways in which humans in the region lived and worked.
- 2. Analyzing how the fall of Rome created a power vacuum in Europe that led to the rise of Feudalism.
- 3. Evaluate the political, economic, and social structure of feudal Europe and how it affected the lives of its inhabitants.
- 4. Describe the events that led to the decline of feudalism and the rise of democratic thought and individualism.
- 5. Build an understanding of the major legal and constitutional developments of the late medieval Era.

Unit Two: West Africa and the Rise of Islam

- 1. Describe the geography and physical features of the Arabian Peninsula.
- 2. Describe key geographic features of West Africa and analyze how this geography influenced the ways in which humans in the region lived and worked.
- 3. Analyze the evolution and achievements of pre-European early societies in West Africa.
- 4. Investigate the three Abrahamic (monotheistic) religions.
- 5. Analyze the development of West African Empires and evaluate the impact of trade on these empires.
- 6. Analyze the causes and effects of the crusades.

Unit Three: Renaissance/Scientific Revolution and Reformation

Renaissance

- 1. Describe the origins and early stages of the Renaissance, the growth of cities, and the focus on the revival of classical learning, arts, and humanism.
- 2. Determine the achievements of scholars and artists during the Renaissance and Scientific Revolution.

Reformation

- 1. Evaluate why the Catholic Church faced criticism during this time period and experienced some loss of power and influence.
- 2. Explain the lasting effects of the Reformation.

Unit Four: Pre-Columbian America

- Describe the key geographical and political features of pre-Columbian American civilizations and analyze how the geography of Central and South America influenced the ways in which humans in the region lived and worked.
- 2. Investigate the development of the following Central and South American civilizations.
- 3. Analyze the cultural achievements of the Maya, Inca, and Aztec civilizations.
- 4. Analyze the significance of the accomplishments, population growth and structure of the civilizations in the Americas prior to European colonization.

Unit Five: Age of Exploration

- 1. Analyze the push/pull factors that led to the age of European exploration and colonization.
- 2. Evaluate the impact of Spanish conquest on Central and South American civilizations.
- 3. Evaluate the impact of the Age of Exploration on Europe (Portugal, Spain, England, France, etc.).
- 4. Assess the enduring impact of the Columbian Exchange and the beginning of the Triangle Trade.
