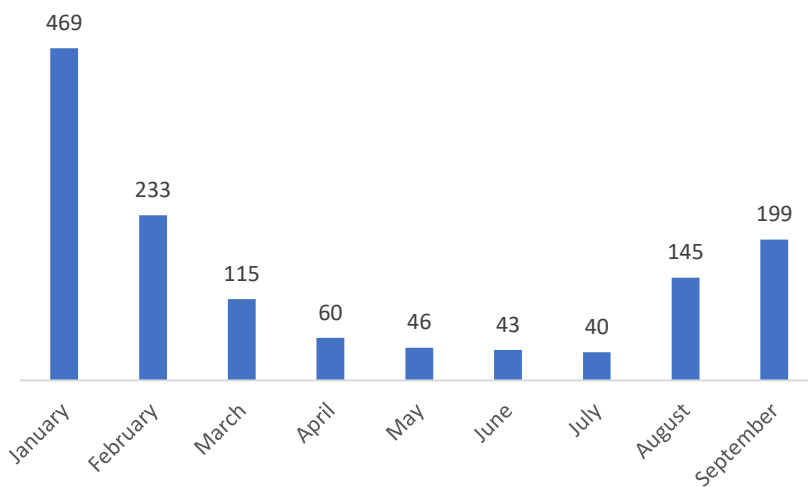

As of October 1st, 2023, the Connecticut Department of Public Health (CT DPH) reported a total of 1350 positive COVID-19 cases in New Britain in 2023 (not including at-home tests).

COVID-19 Monthly 2023

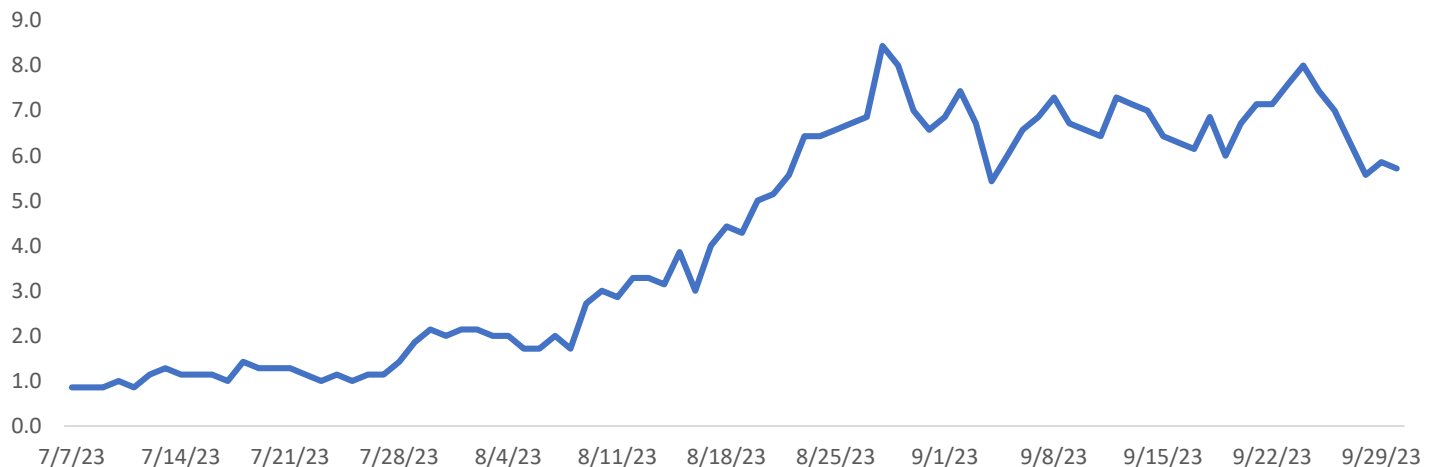


In September 2023, 199 positive COVID-19 cases were reported from CT DPH in New Britain. The case rate for the month of September was 27.43 per 10,000 residents.

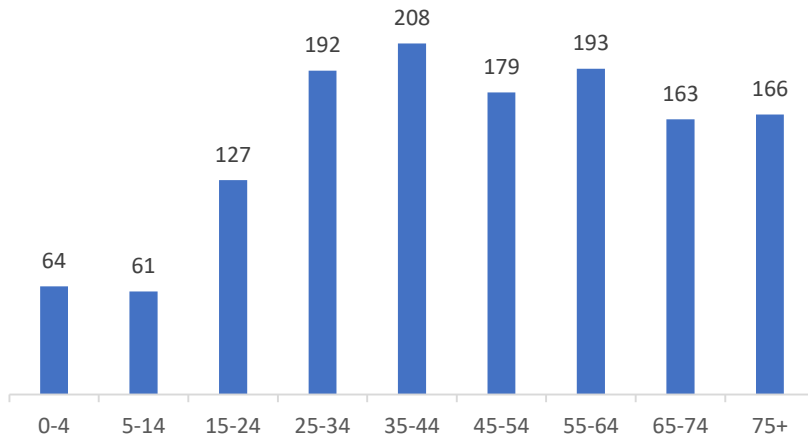

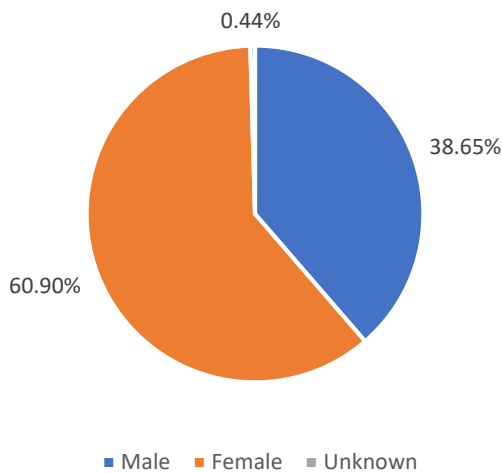
COVID-19 by Age Group

1) AT-HOME COVID-19 TESTS

Beginning September 25, every U.S. household can again place an order to receive four more free COVID-19 rapid tests delivered directly to their home.

Every U.S. household may place an order to receive four free COVID-19 rapid tests delivered directly to your home. **Get four free at-home COVID-19 tests this fall on [COVIDTests.gov](https://www.covidtests.gov)**

At-Home Tests at Retailers and Pharmacies: At-home tests are available for sale around the U.S. Check with local retailers and pharmacies to see where at-home tests are available.

a) **Effective 09/18/23:** The Hospital of Central Connecticut (THOCC) (61 Hart Street, New Britain, CT) is offering COVID-19 Testing on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays from 8AM to 4PM. Appointments are recommended, residents can call (860) 972-8100 / (833) 621-0600 or [schedule online on this link](#).

**Testing from 8-9am is reserved for first responders. Law enforcement officers, paramedics, emergency medical technicians, firefighters and public works personnel simply need to show their ID to receive a COVID-19 PCR test.*

Symptomatic patients: Stay in your car upon arrival and call 860.224.5587 for further instructions

7) GET MEDICATION FOR COVID-19 - TEST TO TREAT LOCATIONS

COVID-19 medications are now available through your doctor, local pharmacies, and health clinics. If you have COVID-19 symptoms and test positive, do not wait to get treated. You must take oral COVID-19 medication within 5 days of your first COVID-19 symptoms. Access <https://covid-19-test-to-treat-locator-dhhs.hub.arcgis.com/> to find a location that is right for you.

In addition to the FQHCs, the nationwide [Test to Treat](#) initiative provides testing for COVID-19 and treatments from a health care provider, all in one location. Connecticut currently has more than 40 Test to Treat sites, which are located at select pharmacies and urgent care centers throughout the state.
