Highland Local School District, located in Medina County, Ohio, offers students a progressive, achievement-oriented educational program and serves approximately 3,300 students from Hinckley, Granger, Sharon, Montville, Copley, Medina, and Brunswick townships. The Highland Local School District ranks as one of the top school districts in Ohio and has consistently received an *Excellent* rating by the Ohio Department of Education for the past 15 years. Highland High School is now ranked 6th out of 146 high schools in the Cleveland Metro area, 29st among Ohio's 741 high schools, and ranks in the top 5% of 17,680 high schools nationally. These accolades have awarded us an overall score of 95.68/100.
