### ACADEMIC OPTIONS

Students may enroll in many courses of various levels of rigor including Honors, Advanced Placement, College in the High School, and CTE Dual Credit courses. In these courses, students have the opportunity to earn university or community college credit while enrolled in our classes. Students can also choose to enroll in full or part-time Running Start, a dual enrollment program where college courses are taken at local community colleges or the Washington Network for Innovative Careers (WANIC) which are offered on multiple campuses.

### COVID DISCLAIMER

For the 2020-21 school year, all students attended school via remote learning using a combination of synchronous and asynchronous learning with the option of returning to campus April 2021 or continue remotely. For the 2021-22 school year, students returned to campus full-time for in-person learning. Since Fall 2020 to present, we use a letter grading scale (A-D) with grades of under 60% earning "N"'s for no credit earned, per district guidance.

### ACADEMIC SUPPORT

To provide students with the necessary time and support to learn, Eastlake offers student interventions during the school day in Math, Science, Literacy, and World Language through a flexible time (Wolf Time) embedded in our schedule to meet the needs of our students. This time allows students to access additional support from teachers and recover missed labs, assignments, or tests.

- ❖ Electives – 4 credits

Graduates must meet standard on Washington State Assessments and complete state High School & Beyond Plan requirements.
