The Community

Spanning 72 square miles in northeast Johnson County, the **Shawnee Mission School District** serves the educational needs of Fairway, Lake Quivira, Leawood, Lenexa, Merriam, Mission, Mission Hills, Mission Woods, Overland Park, Prairie Village, Roeland Park, Shawnee, Westwood, and Westwood Hills. The third largest school district in Kansas, Shawnee Mission School District enjoys a diversified economic base. Currently, the district consists of five high schools, five middle schools, thirty-four elementary schools, Horizons Alternative High School, the Center for Academic Achievement, and the Career and Technical Campus. The district utilizes a K-6, 7-8, 9-12 grade level configuration.

The School

Shawnee Mission West High School opened in 1962 and is a comprehensive four-year high school enrolling 1,625 students in grades nine through twelve. There are 123 certified staff members, 87% of who hold graduate degrees, including 103 master's degrees, 2 educational specialist degrees, and 5 doctorate degrees. One of our staff members earned a National Board for Professional Teaching Standards in school counseling. The staff has incredible teaching experience, averaging 17 years. Shawnee Mission West is accredited by the Kansas State Department of Education and holds membership in the National Association for College Admission Counseling.

The Curriculum

Our academic program is organized on a modified block schedule with the maximum load of 7 credits per year with 1 credit equaling 2 semesters. A minimum of 23.5 credits is required for graduation. Graduation requirements include 4 credits of English, 3 credits of social studies, 3 credits of mathematics, 3 credits of science, 1 credit of fine arts, 1 credit of physical education, ½ credit of health, ½ credit of financial literacy, and 7½ credits of electives. **Students receive an additional grade point in honors and AP classes for grades of A or B. We do not rank students.**

Advanced Placement (AP) courses are offered in Calculus AB and BC, Computer Science, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, European History, French 5, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Physics 1, Physics 2, Psychology, Spanish 5, Statistics, Studio Art, American Government and Politics, and United States History. In 2021-2022, 185 students sat for 323 exams. 52% percent of the 323 exams taken were scored 3 or higher. Students receive an additional grade point in honors and AP classes for grades of A or B.

Honors Courses are offered in seventeen areas: Computer Science Principles, Algebra 2, Biology 1, Chemistry 1, Advanced Debate, Calculus 3, Differential Equations, English 1 & 2, French 6, Geometry, German 4, Music Theory, Precalculus, Principles of Engineering, Spanish 6, and World Regional Studies.

Dual Credit

College Now is a concurrent enrollment partnership program allowing students to obtain college credit while still in high school through **Johnson County Community College** and **Baker University**.

Signature Programs

The Shawnee Mission School District offers Signature Programs in the areas of Animation, Biotechnology, Medical Health Careers, Commercial Baking, Culinary Arts, Law Enforcement and Firefighting, and Project Lead the Way Engineering. Students can attend classes in these specialized curriculums to enhance their college and career readiness.
