Program Description

Gifted students in the high school grades will use an advanced content model in the Advanced Placement (AP) and honors program classes. Students will attend their classes on a daily schedule and will be served a minimum of 5 segments per week.

Students will master the state required standards for Mathematics, English Language Arts, Social Studies, and Science and State Gifted Standards in the content areas of their gifted classes. Students will develop advanced research skills and problem solving skills. They will also enhance their creativity and become more proficient with their communication skills.

Honors Ninth grade literature will be offered in 8th grade to those advanced ELA students; it will count for core credit in high school. The gifted math curriculum includes enrichment and advanced classes with a focus on Algebra I, geometry, and statistics. Algebra - Honors High School Level course is offered in the 8th grade along with a Physical Science High School Honors course for those students that qualify in mathematics and science. These classes are also for high school core credit.

Students will also be eligible to participate in areas of interest and strengths in the Academic Decathlon and gifted study trips and seminars.

Gifted students will also be allowed to enroll in an Executive Internship Course their senior year. Directed Study (independent study), Dual Enrollment, and online courses are also available for gifted students.
