Overview

The MOTSD Board of Education has been working with the district's architects, financial advisors and administration to take steps toward a bond referendum. A referendum is a **responsible financial strategy** to continue investing in our schools' infrastructure and improve facilities to continue supporting the **high level of education** that our Mount Olive community values.

The plan has been carefully researched, and along with input from the community, would position the district for the future. The referendum prioritizes the **health**, **safety and modern instructional needs** of Mount Olive students.

The proposal will be organized into two questions to address the following:

- 1. Upgrades to enhance health and safety at all our schools, and additional space to help maintain small class sizes and support modern educational standards
- 2. Improvements to athletic and transportation facilities

Ballot Question #1

Focus: Infrastructure Updates and Upgraded Spaces

Proposed Projects:

All Schools

- New roofing (except Tinc Road)
- New rooftop HVAC units

Mount Olive High School

- Replacing unit ventilators
- Modernizing temperature controls
- Parking lot paving
- Renovating the Manufacturing Lab
- Expanded athletic trainer's area
- Renovated cardio/fitness area
- Dedicated sensory room

Mount Olive Middle School

• New Wellness Wing (two new classrooms, a Multi-Purpose Room for physical education and other instruction, and storage)

Total Cost: \$52,802,178 in Improvements | State Pays \$11,100,476

Tax Impact: If voters approve Question 1, residents would pay about \$23 per month, for a home assessed at Mount Olive's average of \$322,121.

Chester M. Stephens Elementary School

• Replacing unit ventilators.

Mountain View Elementary School

• Replacing unit ventilators.

Sandshore School

- Installing new HVAC condensing units.
- Adding six new classrooms and four small-group instruction rooms.

Tinc Road School

• Adding six new classrooms and four small-group instruction rooms.

Ballot Question #2

Focus: Improvements to Athletic and Transportation Facilities

Proposed Projects:

 and paint. Expanding the boys' team room and coaches' area. transportation personnel.

Total Cost: \$8,973,111 in Improvements | State Pays \$438,433

Tax Impact: If voters approve Question 2, residents would pay about \$5 per month, for a home assessed at Mount Olive's average of \$322,121.

* Question 2 can only go into effect if voters also approve Question 1.

(*If voters approve both Question 1 and 2, residents would pay just over \$27 per month, for a home assessed at at Mount Olive's average of \$322,121.)

- Math= Grades 3-8, Algebra, Geometry and Algebra II


ISRs were mailed home to families on Monday, October 2nd. Please contact your building principal if you do not received your child's ISR by the end of this week.

The ISR focuses on the student's skill mastery, labeling the student's performance as Beginning, Approaching, Meeting, or Above. It compares the student's score to that of school and district averages.
