The National Junior Beta Club recognizes outstanding achievement, promotes character and social responsibility, encourages service involvement in school and community, fosters leadership skills, grants scholarships, and provides settings for our children to develop interpersonal relationship skills.

NWRMS Junior Beta Club Requirements

Academic Requirement:

- Students must achieve a combined average of 90 in their core classes (Math, Language, Social Studies, and Science) for one semester prior to application to the NWRMS Junior Beta Club. Applications are accepted in the first semester of each school year.
- Students must maintain a combined average of 90 in their core classes to remain an active member. Students who fail to maintain their grades will be considered for academic probation.

Service and Leadership Requirement:

- Students must attend all meetings. If a student misses more than two meetings (unexcused), he/she will no longer be a member of Beta Club (1st Thursday of each month during Zero Block, additional meetings as needed throughout the year). Meeting dates are posted on the Beta Canvas page.
- Students must complete FIVE service hours by Friday, Dec 8, 2023; and they will complete another FIVE service hours in the second semester; altogether, they will complete (and turn in) a minimum of TEN service hours for the school year by Friday, May 3, 2024. For each due date, students will submit a service log via Canvas documenting all service hours, or they will no longer be a member of the Beta Club.
- Students are required to complete at least three different projects.
- Service hour guidelines are on the Beta Canvas page.

Character Requirement:

- Students' behavior should be exemplary in the classroom, at school, and while representing NWRMS and The NWRMS Junior Beta Club.
- Students should have no more than two blocks of ISS as a result of inappropriate behavior.
 - Students with any ISS will NOT be allowed to participate in the Beta Retreat or State Convention.
- Students should never have a full day (or more) of In School Suspension or Out of School Suspension.
- Students who fail to maintain exemplary behavior will be considered for academic probation and/or immediate removal by the Faculty Sponsors.

Application:

It is each 6th-8th grade student's responsibility to fill out the application that is sent to their email. They must be signed into their student email to complete the application. Applications are accepted in the first semester of each school year.
