 - d. Promoting growth in our Learning Dispositions (Resilience, Resourcefulness, Relating and Reflectiveness)
 - e. Collaborating with the Student Support Team (SST) and executing ILPs as appropriate for students in their charge
- 3. Building positive interpersonal relationships
 - a. Promoting positive interactions among students who have differing cultural, linguistic and national backgrounds
 - b. Fostering a sense of identity and pride in the school among students, parents, and colleagues
