Edina Public Schools is committed to the safety and security of all individuals on our campuses. We recognize that while serious events cannot always be prevented, we can enact best practices to increase our security posture. As such, we adopt a layered security approach. A strong partnership with our emergency response personnel is critical. We know the work of school safety is ongoing.

BERT: Building Emergency Response Team

DERT: District Emergency Response Team

 Superintendent, Superintendent's Cabinet Team, Director of Buildings & Grounds, Other Staff as Designated

- Offers resources and provides training for crisis response and post-crisis reunification.
 - Standard Response Protocol (SRP) and Standard Reunification Method (SRM)
- Used in more than 45,000 school districts, departments, agencies, and organizations
- Research-based best practices of school administrators, psychologists, public safety experts, families, and first responders
- District Leadership training on August 4, 2023
- Training for all staff via district and building

- Schools own the students.
- Police own the crime.
- Fire owns the flames.
- Paramedics own the patients.

I Love U Guys Foundation



- **Hold.** Hold in your room or area. Clear hallways. Business inside continues as usual, with the exception of the impacted area. *Typically used during a medical scenario.*
- **Secure.** Get inside. Lock outside doors. Business inside continues as usual. *Used when there is a threat to safety outside, such as a neighborhood police situation.*
- **Lockdown.** Doors locked and lights turned off. Students and staff position themselves out of the sight of an intruder. Often used for an active shooter scenario.
- **Evacuate.** Leave the building and move to a specified location. *Typically used for a fire.*
- **Shelter.** Take shelter in a designated location. *This occurs most often for severe weather such as a tornado.*

Standard Response Protocol (SRP)



 Accountable reunification of students with parents or guardians in the event of a school crisis or emergency

• 2 types:

- On-site
- Off-site

Basic Process

- Stand-up location
 - Establish student assembly area
 - Create accountability/attendance area
- Notification to families
- Greeters distribute Reunification Card and review process
- o Parent/Guardian completes the card and brings to check-in
- Parent/Guardian ID is verified. Card is split.
- Parent/Guardian brings bottom card to reunifier
- Reunifier recovers student and delivers to parent/guardian
- Accountability: The one non-negotiable



Standard Reunification Method (SRM)

- Provides a layer of security regarding who has access to our buildings.
- Provides a helpful reference for who we need to account for during an incident or crisis.
- Enables district staff to scan visitors against the national sex offender registry, as well as custom flags within our student information system.
- All visitors will show an ID to be scanned into the system.
 - Multiple ID types are accepted
 - Upon approval a badge is printed
 - If necessary, alerts are sent to appropriate building personnel



Raptor Visitor Management

Each coach/advisor, site supervisor and event worker use the school safe conditions format and standard response protocols (SRP) for practices/competitions

	Call 911, clear area. Designate person to meet first responder	Coordinate with police	If you know location of intruder, consider escaping if safely able	Assist others to nearest exit. Notify district officials	Emergency Action Plans. Remain in shelter in place until 'all clear' determined

Extracurricular Activities

Community Education out of school time programming, *meaning programming that runs before and after the regular school day until 6:00pm* at the Early Learning Center and Elementary sites follow these standard procedures for monitoring and welcoming families into the buildings:

- At the Early Learning Center, Raptor verification is required for any adult coming into the building to pick up their children.
- At the Elementary Sites, Enrichment and Kids Club programming has designated staff at the pick up entrance to greet adults and release students.
- Training on the Standard Response Protocol is provided to all staff.






