








Space Camp Week For GSMS

Life Science with A Schaff: I don't want to forget these memories with this curious, fun-spirited, competitive, and kind-hearted bunch! This week, we chanted cadences across the lawns of NASA's Space Camp in Huntsville, AL. We built and launched rockets, and we learned about past and present space exploration. We also simulated the 5 degrees of freedom, axis training, G-forces, and a mock mission. Because of these kids' tenacity, the spirit of Gulf Shores shined brightly this week!



GSHS Environmental Science

Gulf Shores High School Environmental Science students have been oyster gardening weekly this semester. Oyster populations in Mobile Bay have declined and students are raising oysters to help restore natural oyster reefs. Did you know 1 oyster can filter up to 50 gallons of water a day? In addition to filtration, oysters provide habitat for over 300 species. Students have learned how to identify different organisms that live in an oyster garden, conduct small sample population estimates of oyster size and quantity, and how to maintain the gardens for optimal numbers and growth. Thank you to Little Lagoon Preservation Society for mentoring our students and providing a pier for us to raise the oysters!











Life Science with A. Staff

Today, we dipped our paintbrushes in Wolf Bay and painted scenes of salt marshes and palustrine wetlands. Before paddling out, Mrs. Jackie taught us that these increasingly precious wild spaces have many functions for humans and wildlife. In addition to providing habitat for many commercially important seafood, these living shorelines protect our neighborhoods by absorbing storm surge. Alabama Department of Environmental Management has rated Wolf Bay as an outstanding body of water. It's not only a sanctuary for incredibly diverse organisms, but it's also safe for us to fish and play. At the end of our day, students said, "I think we should protect nature because we want our kids and grandkids to be able to enjoy these experiences, too." We are grateful for all of the people before us who have protected these spaces for us to cherish today. Special thanks to Mr. Talantis, Mrs. Rachel, Mrs. Good, and Mrs. Sawyer– our parent volunteers–for helping make this trip possible!



Gulf Shores City Schools, in cooperation with HNH Immunizations (Health Hero), will be offering a Flu vaccine clinic in our schools. The clinic will be held on October 20, 2023, and there is no charge to parents for this service. If your child has Medicaid, All Kids or private insurance, HNH will bill the insurance company for the flu vaccine. If your child is uninsured, the flu vaccine will be given free of charge. HNH is unable to provide the flu vaccine for students covered under PEEHIP insurance.

Consent forms will be sent home with all K-5th grade students and may be requested at the middle school and high school by contacting the school nurse or printed from home.
