ABOUT

Founded in 1990, the American International School in Egypt (AIS) Main Campus is an independent, co-educational day school for grades K – 12, located in the suburb of New Cairo. The majority of AIS faculty are certified teachers from diverse backgrounds. Approximately 45% of AISE faculty hold advanced degrees. All instruction is in English, except for foreign language classes. Arabic, Spanish, and French language classes are taught by native speakers. Most AIS students are multilingual. Although English is typically not spoken at home, students perform in a demanding college preparatory curriculum.

Approximately 32% of all grade 11 and 12 students are in the IB program. The predicted grades reflect the students' aspirations, which are established through an evaluation of their cumulative coursework, June Mock Exams, and baseline exams held in early October. The allocation of Bonus/Core points is determined by assessing the student's performance in both Extended Essay (EE) and Theory of Knowledge (TOK), utilizing the IB Core matrix as a reference.

COVID

In March of 2020, AIS courses went completely online. Students were responsible to complete a full course load with online synchronous and asynchronous classes. The Egyptian Ministry of Education dictated that no student could fail due to online classes. Any student who was passing a course before the online term began received credit for that course. The lowest grade awarded during the online term was 60%. Please note that if a student was failing a course prior to the online term and has not raised their grade to a pass with the online term, they did not receive the credit.

In 2020-2021, classes started online. In mid-September a hybrid model was implemented in which students attended classes one week and worked online the next week. All IB diploma and course students attended school daily. In 2021-2022, students resumed in-person learning. Students who were ill were allowed to attend online.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Previously, all AIS students were required to earn 25 Creativity, Action, and Service (CAS) hours per year. In 2020-21, the CAS program was revised to consist of students' experiential learning in the areas of creativity, activity and service throughout the year. Students are no longer required to complete specific hours in each category. Instead, they engage in a reflective process.

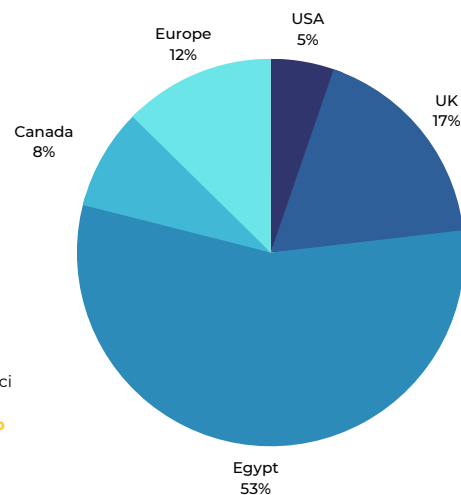

CREDITS AND GRADING

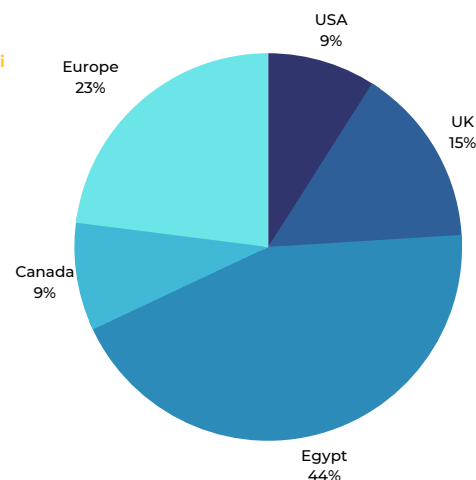
