**Campus:** The campus includes a Lower School, Middle School, and Upper School located in the Shadyside neighborhood of Pittsburgh, **less than one mile from Carnegie Mellon University and the University of Pittsburgh.** 

Joan Clark Davis Center for Interdisciplinary Learning: Opened for the 2023-2024 school year, this new facility is designed so the school can continue to adapt space for project-based and community-based learning while creating collaboration among humanities, engineering, arts, and science programs. Additionally, the space will expand the impact of the school's renowned City as Our Campus program, which connects students in all grade levels with mentors from the academic, cultural, scientific, non-profit, and business communities in Pittsburgh.

ceased in-person instruction on March 13, 2020, and transitioned to an entirely virtual learning environment on April 1, 2020. The 2020-2021				

ceased in-person instruction on March 13, 2020, and transitioned to an entirely virtual learning environment on April 1, 2020. The 2020-2021 school year began in an entirely virtual learning environment and transitioned to a hybrid learning model beginning on September 16, 2020, where students rotated on a weekly basis between in-person and synchronous virtual learning.

WT's grading policy remained a traditional A-F scale (the grade of A+ is not awarded) regardless of instruction method.
