PRINCIPAL'S REPORT:

1. Grades 2 and 6 completed gifted testing this month.
2. Students in grades 5-12 participated in a nicotine vaping prevention program presented by Mercy Health. The program is entitled CATCH My Breath and is an evidence-based vaping prevention program that empowers students with the knowledge and skills needed to make informed decisions about e-cigarettes and resist social pressures to vape.

MISSION

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3. We completed our first ALICE drill on September 28th where we practiced sheltering in place. We were able to complete the drill in just over 2 minutes. All rooms were locked, windows covered, and we could hear bolo sticks dropping into their holes as we stood in the hallways.
4. The K-2 staff met to conduct a review of their report cards, aiming to ensure alignment with educational standards, accurate representation of curriculum coverage, and clear communication of student progress to parents. We collected samples of report cards from neighboring schools as a reference. Our next step is to reconvene for further discussions and recommendations regarding potential changes for the 2024-2025 school year.
5. This month, we handed out 264 RISE tickets, and during our first monthly RISE drawing, we were able to give out 30 prizes, across both high school and elementary. We will celebrate our first RISE day on October 19th. Elementary students will celebrate with a glow dance party hosted by DJ Nick Kerpsack. High school homerooms will be competing in a volleyball tournament. They can win extra points for things like a team name, team colors, a team uniform, a team chant, getting their homeroom teacher to participate, etc.
6. Mr. Hammond and I are also excited to share that we are collaborating with Rachael Ayers, an education innovation specialist from the ESC, to introduce a monthly learning series aimed at increasing our knowledge of emerging technologies, specifically artificial intelligence (AI) to discover how it can transform teacher (and principal) effectiveness, student engagement and overall productivity. Sessions will be held here after school.
7. Grade 3 will take their fall state test in ELA on October 24th and 25th. The test consists of two 90 minute sessions in which the students are tested on reading informational text, reading literary text and writing (opinion and informative/explanatory). In the writing component students are required to construct a multi-paragraph text-based response in which they present or analyze information or support an opinion/argument.

ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL'S RECOGNITIONS:

1. Each month, Mr. Hammond invites teachers to nominate K-12 students who consistently exhibit the qualities of R.I.S.E. (respectful, inclusive, safe, and engaged) in school. Teachers are asked to provide a brief description of the student's behavior, attitude and work ethic in their classroom.

Mr. Hammond then recognizes each student in school by awarding them a Rocket Spotlight certificate, a formal letter is mailed home informing the student's parents/guardians of their recognition, students have their picture taken as a group and it is shared on the school website, Facebook and school media class publication; and lastly, each student will receive a treat from the cafeteria.
