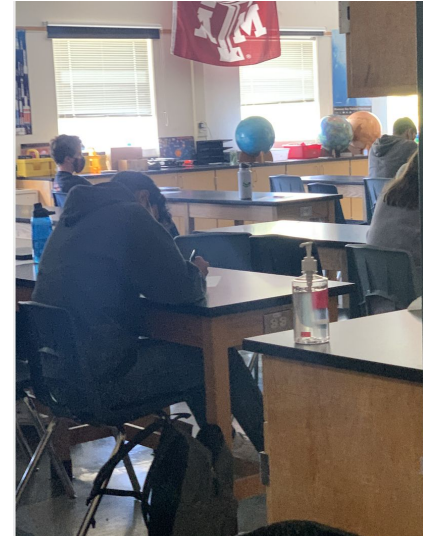

TUHSD Priorities

1. **Equity of Learning Opportunity:** Providing more resources to those who need it in order to access learning
2. **Excellent Educational Programming:**
 - Ensuring robust course offerings in a 7 period day, which allows students to explore elective courses in areas of high interest
 - Maintaining competitive salaries for our educators in order to attract and retain highly qualified teachers
3. **Student Supports & Well-being:** Building and maintaining a Counseling and Wellness program that provide expanded social-emotional support services to all of our students

Remainder of Spring 2021

- 82% of students returned to full time in person learning today-**April 13th**
- **California Department of Public Health guidance:**
 - physical distancing of a **minimum of 3 feet**
 - Universal mask wearing
 - Hand and respiratory hygiene
- Students have a **choice** of whether they return to full time in person learning **OR** remain in distance learning
 - Students choosing in person must attend every day
 - They will not have the option of zooming unless they are required to quarantine due to COVID-19
 - Students who choose to remain in distance learning may change their mind and return to in-person learning at any time during the remainder of the semester-they must let their site administration know their plan to return



Remainder of Spring 2021

- **Monday, April 12th and Monday, April 19th** will be virtual days
 - SBAC tests will be administered on those days
- The remaining Monday's in the semester will be in person
- A Day and B Day refer to the periods that meet, not cohorts (at Drake/1327 it is even and odd days)

Spring Break

- **Public Health emphasized staying vigilant about following protocols**
- **If you travel:**
 - Wear a mask at all times unless only spending time with members of your immediate household or you are vaccinated with other vaccinated people
 - Wash your hands frequently with soap
- **Travel Advisory:**
 - Marin Public Health recommends quarantining after out of state travel
 - 10 day quarantine, can test out after 5 days (*negative COVID test no sooner than 5 days after return from out of state*)

Preparation for In-Person Learning

- Safety Plans for Every School-*link on the website*
- Safety Committee reviews all new guidelines and adjusts protocols
- Air purifiers in classrooms and office spaces installed
- Plexiglass shields for office spaces and those in areas which 6ft of space is not possible
- All staff having opportunity to be fully vaccinated
- Mask mandates at all times except when eating outside, 6 feet apart
- Training on specific cleaning protocols
- Passive Screener for illness
- Traffic patterns within buildings established to minimize contact between students
- Outdoor tents for break and lunchtime

Sports: Spring 2021

- **Purple Tier Sports**

- February 22, 2021: Cross Country, Swimming, & Diving
- March 1, 2021: Girls Tennis, Girls Golf
- April 12, 2021: Track & Field
- April 19, 2021: Boys Tennis, Boys Golf

- **Red Tier Sports** (*Marin County must be in the Red/Substantial Tier for these sports to begin*)

- March 15, 2021: Baseball, Softball, Girls Lacrosse, and Field Hockey

- **Orange Tier Sports** (*Marin County must be in the Orange Tier for these sports to begin*)

- March 1, 2021: Football & Sideline Cheer (Football)-*allowed prior to being in Orange because adjusted case rate per CDPH and being outdoors*
- April 12, 2021: Soccer (Boys & Girls), Volleyball (Boys & Girls), & Boys Lacrosse
- April 19, 2021: Water Polo (Boys & Girls)

- **Yellow Tier Sports** (*Marin County must be in the Yellow Tier for these sports to begin*)

- April 19, 2021: Basketball (Boys & Girls), Sideline Cheer (Basketball), and Wrestling

Sports: Spring 2021

- Out of state travel for sports competition is **prohibited** by state and local public health
- If you travel out of state against guidelines, you must quarantine for **10 days**
 - Can test out of quarantine after **5 days** (*test no sooner than 5 days after return*)
 - Public health recommends that all family members test
- **Spectators:** There are a limited number of spectators allowed at school sporting events
 - Some schools in the county are not allowing any spectators, Tam District is asking parents and families to abide by the distancing and mask wearing guidelines at all times when on our campuses

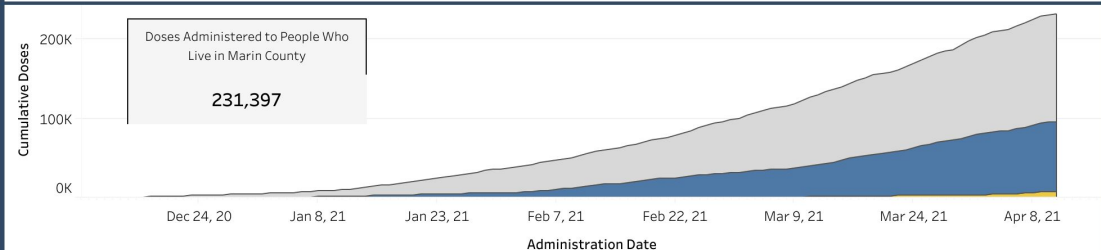
Case control investigation (154 case-patients, 243 control-participants), MS, September-November, 2020

VACCINES

- Marin County is planning a series of student focused vaccination clinics in the coming weeks
- Students 16 and up are be eligible to receive the Pfizer vaccine
- Students 12-15 could be eligible for the Pfizer vaccine by the end of April
- According to Marin Public Health, 69.4% of county residents 16 and over have received 1 dose and 45.4% are fully vaccinated
- Marin Public Health has estimated that all eligible county residents who wish to receive the vaccine will be able to do so by the middle of May.

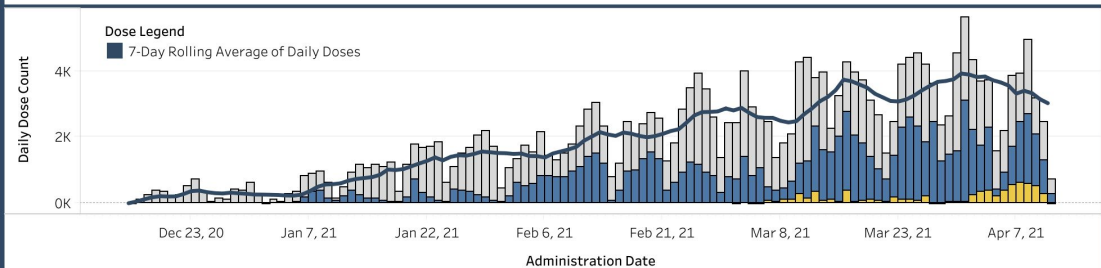
Cumulative Doses by Vaccination Date (People Who Live in Marin County)

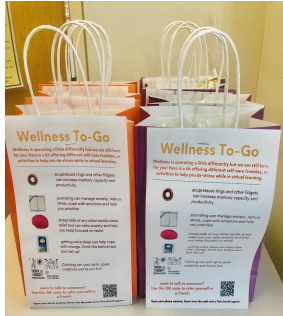

Graduation

- In person graduations are likely
 - Marin County Public Health to provide updated guidelines April 16th
- State guidelines require:
 - Graduates seated 6 feet apart
 - All attendees to remain 6 feet apart
 - Attendees from the same household may sit closer than 6 feet
 - Attendees must register for the event ahead of time
 - All participants must adhere to mask wearing and all other public health guidelines
- *Last update we had from Public Health said proms and other large events (especially those with food) would not be allowed*

Looking Forward: FALL 2021

- In August 2021 we will open to full in person learning for the 2021-22 school year
- The following mitigation measures remain in effect per local and state public health:
 - Physical distancing of a **minimum of 3 feet** between students
 - A **minimum of 6 feet** between adults and between adults and students
 - Universal mask wearing
- At 3 feet of distancing, we can accommodate all students for in person learning
