# Wausau School District Receives Multi-Year Grant to Support Mental Health Programming for Students



The Wausau School District is able to support the mental health of students even more thanks to a multi-year grant from Connexus Cares -- the philanthropic program at Connexus Credit Union. During the Education/Operations Committee Meeting on Monday, September 25, they presented the School Board with a check for \$120,000 (\$40,000 per year for the next 3 years). In addition, the Wausau School District also received a \$20,000 check from the WEA Member Benefits Foundation to support the cause. The remaining funding of \$40,000 will come from the state Department of Public Instruction over the next three years.

The money the District received, will allow us to hire a Homelessness Mental Health Navigator. This person will lead initiatives around school-based counseling services, increased academic-career planning for secondary students experiencing homelessness, as well as increased community collaboration with other local school districts and the Marathon County Health Department.

"The Wausau School District is so grateful to Connexus Credit Union and the WEA Member Benefits Association, as well as DPI, for this amazing gift that will allow us to improve mental health services and programs for our students, parents, faculty, and staff. The ability to focus solely on the students' overall well-being and mental health, when combined with academics, will no doubt help them reach their full potential," said Wausau School District Coordinator of Pupil Services Andy Grimm.

"When the Wausau School District shared their recent findings with us regarding the state of mental health among Wausau-area students, the statistics really spoke for themselves," said Boyd Gustke, Connexus President and Chief Executive Officer. "It was an immediate call for help that we didn't hesitate to answer, knowing that the time is now to advocate for our future generations. The students are our leaders of tomorrow, and it's critical that we do everything in our power to address mental health issues early on and set our children up for success. Connexus is grateful to have the opportunity to support this initiative, and we encourage others to join us in our efforts to create stability and meaningful change in our community."

The Wausau School District is fortunate to have such wonderful state and community partners that work to support our students. It means so much to us and we're extremely grateful.



# **District Restructuring Updates**

The Wausau School District is working extremely hard to ensure the restructuring is done well and that it benefits our students, their families, and our staff. As we plan for that, we're exploring possible solutions to inadequate Science spaces at Wausau West. We've been working closely with staff at Wausau West and Wausau East to work through this challenge. To ensure transparency, we also want to make sure the Board, and the broader community, are aware of it too so that collectively we can come together to discuss and work through possible solutions. At the end of the day, our goal of the restructure is to ensure that students have expanded developmentally-appropriate opportunities and stronger supports.

# **West High National Merit Scholarship Semifinalists**

Congratulations to Madeline Hahn and Luke Kedrowski, West High seniors, for being named National Merit® Scholarship Semifinalists in the 69th annual National Merit® Scholarship Program!

Over 1.5 million juniors in about 21,000 high schools enter the National Merit Scholarship Program each year by taking the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT®). To become a Finalist, the Semifinalist and a high school official must submit a detailed scholarship application to provide information about the Semifinalist's academic record, participation in school and community activities, demonstrated leadership abilities, employment, and honors and awards received.

This year, 16,000 talented high school seniors have an opportunity to continue in the competition for 7,140 National Merit Scholarships worth nearly \$28 million that will be offered next spring. To be considered for a Merit Scholarship® award, Semifinalists must fulfill several requirements to advance to the Finalist level of the competition. About 95 percent of the Semifinalists are expected to attain Finalist standing, and approximately half of the Finalists will win a National Merit Scholarship, earning the Merit Scholar® title.



# **West High National Merit Commended Scholar**

Congratulations to Jacob "Jake" Hahn, senior at West High, for being named a National Merit® Commended Scholar in the 69th annual National Merit® Scholarship Program! Over 1.5 million juniors enter the National Merit Scholarship Program each year by taking the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT®). Commended recognition is given to students in approximately the top 96th percentile of all scores.


# 67th Annual Bill Smiley Invitational Cross Country Meet

#### **Download FirstView®: A Vital Communication Tool**

Now that we are a month into school, we want to remind you to download a vital communication tool for parents of students who utilize First Student (yellow buses) to get to and from school.

The FirstView® app tracks your student's bus AND it can provide updates on bus cancellations: weather, or otherwise. Since the start of the school year, there have been a few glitches with the app. We've worked through those and now it's officially working as it should! If you'd prefer to register with your student's ID, <u>click here</u>. If you don't have your student's ID or can't remember what it is, remember you can access it in Infinite Campus. An IMPORTANT NOTE: In order to receive bus cancellation notifications, you need to ensure notifications are allowed for FirstView® in your phone settings. We encourage you to add up to 3 emails that will receive these notifications. You can do this by navigating in the app to Settings > Notification Recipients.


### **Building Trades and Advanced Manufacturing Students Attend the Bricklayer 500**


