Areas to Grow in

Some staff were asked what areas they would like to grow in as a school or as an individual.

- I want to improve my use of pre-conference and post-conferences to focus on the
 effectiveness of coaching to make an impact on teaching and learning. I look forward to
 having behavior plans established for our most challenging students to outline our
 interventions/protocols so that staff members supervise consistently.
- I think better communication. It has been brought to my attention the fact that some staff
 would appreciate a face to face conversation about schedule changes to discuss any
 concerns and not in email form. (When we don't have subs to fill in for absent staff members
 schedules need to be alerted.)
- Finding time to meet as a team seems to be a struggle with the new curriculum and extra
 planning required (though we do have small informal meetings frequently).
- School Friday donuts, a tier 3 classroom to help support our students and Mrs. Z. Individual learning how to teach my students better.
- Being more firm in my expectations, don't allow the small things to slide. This is both personal and school wide.

Principal's Bright Spots

- The E3 safety system is now installed in all computers and most personal phones of our staff members. E3 is a mass notification system which connects employees, administrators, and first responders in the case of emergencies. It also has been used this month for our off-site evacuation and fire drill practice.
- We had a great kick-off meeting for Shadow Butte's PTO. So many positive families are involved in teaming up to make our school great.
- Parent Night for first grade was held this month where parents were given insights into where their student was academically and how best to partner with the teachers to support learning.
- The Lee Pesky Learning team supported our first year teachers in an all day professional learning opportunity around writing and literacy. In addition, they will attend 1 PLC meeting per month to offer further training in writing instruction
- Safety comes before anything else in our schools and we are receiving great feedback from families about the new Safe ID systems that were installed this month in our school.
- We had our first instructional round that allowed kindergarten and 4th grade teachers to observe their fellow teachers and learn from each other.
- We held student council elections and our newly elected group is already spreading positivity
 with a fun chalk activity that they led as they welcomed students to school on Friday morning.
- The Huskie Hustle is a fun activity and fundraiser that we hold at SBE and this month. We held a t-shirt design contest to determine which artwork would be represented on the event shirts. (see pictures below)




