We were excited to discover that the humane traps we had helped to set up last week on the reserve, had been a success. Out of the 40 traps set, 20 had a small mammal inside them when checked first thing the next morning by the reserve volunteers. Harvest mice were the most popular find and they were weighed, given a quick health check and then happily released back into the wild. Other jobs we have been involved in over the last two visits include cutting back willow trees to allow more light to shine onto the waterways and bringing in the black reptile mats for the winter, that have been out all summer as a secluded space for reptiles to hide out.













#### **COMMUNITY OUTREACH - WEEKLY UPDATE**

This week we harvested the rest of the pumpkin field, filling the trailer with pumpkins ranging from egg size to the size of a cows head! We boxed, stamped and stacked an astonishing 1,890 eggs as well as shooing some naughty escapee chickens back into their orchard.




#### ANCIENT EGYPTIAN WORKSHOP

A write up by pupil **Jack G** - "On Friday morning we went to the ancient Egyptian workshop in the school pavilion. Both Mr Young's and my class attended the lesson. First, we sat patiently waiting to be told what activities we were going to do. After, it was explained what we're going to do. My group started digging for artefacts in the sand pit. First, I saw an ancient bug called a scarab in the sand pit. Then, we found models of servants that were in the tombs with the pharaohs. When we finished exploring the sand pit, we then started painting scarab beetles. Meanwhile the teacher told us that all colours represented something, for example, green represents life.

Once we completed painting the scarab beetles, we practised making ancient bread. It was harder than it looks to make. Firstly, I cut up dates, although some of them fell on the floor, I put the rest inside the bread as instructed. This was quite tricky. Secondly, I had to make the bread into a ball and put it in a cup. This was very difficult because the bread kept changing shape and the dates fell out. I eventually got it in the cup.

After all of that we started to dress up as ancient Egyptians, I put all the clothes on to make me look like a real Egyptian. I am looking forward to learning more at the next lesson."


