A message from Mrs Tomlinson...

We have reached the end of the half term just as the temperatures begin to plummet which is somewhat par for the course, I suppose. I do hope that your children have enjoyed this first half term of a new school year and are happy and settled at Lynch Hill.

We welcomed our Slough School Effectiveness Partner to school on Wednesday afternoon so she could carry out her annual visit and she got the opportunity to review our school data, discuss our targets for this academic year and visit a number of classrooms. Such visits are important to us, allowing us to reflect on the strengths of the school and the next steps that we wish to implement so that we can continue on an improvement journey. I have said before, we never want to be complacent and external scrutiny is incredibly valuable.

It was lovely to see the children undertaking a wide range of activities on Wednesday afternoon. In EYFS, lots of the children were extending their learning outdoors and it was great to see them making the most of the newly refurbished areas. My mouth was watering when we visited year 1 as they had been chopping vegetables and making dips as part of their food technology work. In year 2, the children were very busy with a design and technology project making fire engines, whilst one class in year 3 were thoroughly enjoying their Spanish lesson with Mr Paches. Elsewhere in KS2, we saw more design and technology sessions and the progression from one year to the next was evident. The children were able to talk clearly about what they were learning and how it linked to previous learning. I talk to staff about not a moment being wasted and it was great to see that being the case in classes.

Wednesday really was a very busy day as we also had the school nursing team in delivering the flu vaccinations to those children with permission. It may be the case that there were some children absent or whose parents did not complete the online form giving permission. The nursing team are therefore going to be re-visiting after half term (Friday 1st December) to offer the vaccination to any additional pupils in the hope that we can increase the uptake this year. Look out for further information regarding this.

We have a group of pupils in year 3 and year 4 who have headed off to PGL today on a weekend residential. They

were full of excitement this morning and I know that they are going to have the most wonderful time (even if it is a little wet). I would like to take this opportunity to extend my thanks to the staff members who have been so willing to give up their weekend in order to accompany the children and ensure they have a memorable experience. I look forward to hearing all the stories from PGL upon their return.

For those with children entitled to free school meals, Slough Local Authority have once again opted to use the HUGG platform to purchase the vouchers to support families during the half term holiday period. You will receive an email regarding this and how to access the vouchers (£15 per eligible child).

I would like to wish you all a wonderful half term and look forward to welcoming the children back on Monday 30th October.

Measles

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Measles cases are rising across the country, with over 102,000 children starting primary school in England being at risk of catching the disease.

- Nine out of ten children can catch measles from an infected classmate
- One in five children will require a hospital visit if they become unwell with measles
- Measles cases are rising across England and are over double the figures from last year
- One in 15 children develop serious complications from a measles infection, which can include meningitis and blindness
- There is no medical treatment for measles; vaccination is the best protection against becoming seriously unwell
- The Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccine is safe and has been used since the early 1980s.
- Over 20 million cases of measles have been prevented since the start of measles vaccination in the UK. Over 4,500 lives have been saved as a result (81 lives per year)
- MMR vaccination is free on the NHS with the first dose being offered when a child is one year and the second at 3 years and 4 months old. This provides long lasting protection against measles, mumps and rubella which can cause long term health conditions such as blindness and asthma.
- The evidence is clear; there is no link between the MMR vaccine and autism

If your child has missed their first or second dose of MMR vaccine, contact your GP practice to book an appointment. If you are unsure if your child is due a vaccination or has missed a vaccination, check their red book or contact your GP practice. For adults, it is never too late to catch up on any missed MMR vaccinations, contact your GP practice to book an appointment. For more information visit the NHS website
Measles is highly infectious and if left unvaccinated nine out of ten children in an early years setting can catch the disease if just one child is infectious.

IT IS IMPORTANT THAT YOU TAKE TIME TO READ THIS INFORMATION WHICH OUTLINES THE APPLICATION PROCESS FOR A RECEPTION SCHOOL PLACE

Dear Parent / Carer,

If your child was born between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020, and you live in Slough, you can now apply for a Reception school place in an infant or primary school. The Citizen's portal on the council website is now open to receive applications. There are clear and simple prompts to guide you through making your application.

If your child was born between 1 September 2016 and 31 August 2017, lives in Slough and currently attends an infant school, they will need to transfer to Year 3 in a junior school.

You will also find the *Starting Infant, Junior and Primary School* booklet on the council website which contains a wealth of information to help you choose the right schools, make an application and understand how the application process works. It provides a profile of all of Slough Primary schools alongside information about admission arrangements.

Who should apply?

If you have a child who was born between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020, you must apply for a school place for September 2024.

When do I need to apply?

You can apply anytime from 4th September 2023. To receive an offer of a school place on national offer day, you must submit an application by 15 January 2024.

Please note: In order to maximise your chances of being offered one of your preferred schools

- You MUST submit an application with any required documents/supplementary forms on time.
- Your child must meet the admissions criteria of the school to be offered a place.

- NO automatic transfer from a nursery into a school.
- NO automatic offer of a sibling place without making an application.

Closing date to apply Monday 15 January 2024

What happens if I miss the closing date?

For the avoidance of doubt, all applications submitted and received after the closing date (15 January) will be deemed as late applications. They will be considered after those that are received on time and after the first round of offers have been made.

How do I apply?

If you live in Slough you MUST apply through Slough Borough Council. The easiest way to apply is online.

Go to slough.gov.uk/school-admissions and follow the instructions on the screen. If you do not have internet access at home you can still apply online at your local library or at the council offices.

Who can submit the application?

Applications must be made by a parent or carer who holds legal parental responsibility for a child. Only one application should be made per child.

Mental And Dental Health Can Affect Each Other

These can impact on oral health:

- Poor nutrition
- Lack of a toothbrushing routine
- Medication
- Specific behaviours such as over-vigorous brushing
- Anxiety – which can lead to fear of visiting the dentist

Some mental health disorders can lead to behaviours or problems that affect oral health

Poor oral and dental health can lead to dissatisfaction with dental appearance which can cause low self-esteem and social anxieties

Good oral health is essential for general health and wellbeing

Caring for your teeth and gums:

- Brush teeth twice a day for two minutes, before bedtime and at one other time of the day using fluoride toothpaste containing at least 1,350ppm. Spit excess toothpaste, don't rinse.
- Clean in between your teeth at least once a day using interdental brushes or floss
- Cut down on how often you have sugary foods and drinks
- Visit your dentist regularly
