IMPORTANT REMINDER -ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Viking Families,

One of our goals at SM West this year is to improve student attendance, especially our chronic absenteeism.

Chronic absenteeism is defined as missing 10% of the school year, or just 2-3 missed days a month. Chronic absenteeism is NOT truancy.

Chronic absenteeism includes both excused and unexcused absences, whereas truancy includes only unexcused absences (truancy is filed at 10 unexcused absences) .

Last year SM West's chronic absenteeism was at 38%, while the state average was at 19%. We can and must do better. Please take a few moments and read through <u>THIS LETTER</u> to find out how you can help us improve our chronic absenteeism.




The Father's Club is a dad-led, grass roots effort promoting intentionality around dads' relationships and time spent with their families, with each other and within the community.





CREATING THE SCHOOL-STUDENT-HOME RELATIONSHIP.

As a parent of an elementary student, volunteering to help the school seemed easy: Bring treats to a classroom party, help chaperone a field trip, chip in for a school fundraiser...etc. But is it still necessary when my student in high school? The answer is Yes!

It is important that the school and families work together to create the best educational experience for our students. One great way to provide that support is to make it a priority to attend parent teacher conferences. If you are unable to come in person, then reach out to your children's teachers to schedule a phone call or a WebEx meeting.

Another way is to come to a Shawnee Mission West event like a concert or a sporting event or the Senior Viking Pageant. Even if your student isn't performing, playing, or competing, show your student the importance of creating a school culture and support their fellow students.

Many parents find great satisfaction in volunteering to support the school. If your student is involved in an extracurricular activity, chances are they have a parent group that supports the activity. Maybe you will sign up to help coat check for the dances or provide a food item for a team dinner or for the West Staff. Some of you might even be interested in becoming a

SMSD MVP.

Many parents think they may not have time to come to an event or to volunteer to help, but even small contributions can make a big impact.

Research shows that being a parent volunteer positively impacts schools in various ways – it strengthens school-home partnerships, improves student academic performance and behavior, fosters a sense of community, and boosts teacher morale. Schools with higher parental involvement also report lower rates of absenteeism and dropout and higher graduation rates.

As our year continues to progress, take time to read the newsletters to find out how you can support our Viking Nation. We can't wait to see you.





Print image dimensions must be no smaller than 3x5 inches and no larger than 8x10 inches. Digital image dimensions must be at least 640x960 (pixels) and 300 dpi (resolution). Accepted file formats: JPEG, JPG, and PNG.

Visual Arts

Works of both fine and design arts are accepted, including but not limited to: architectural drawing and models, ceramics, collage, computer generated images and graphics, crafts, drawing, fashion clothes.






PARKING PERMITS



I wanted to share a "refresher" on Covid Guidelines for everyone as we head into this fall. These are also guidelines that apply to Influenza A & B.

- Day 0: the 1st day of symptoms or test positive day
- Counting from Day 0--a person is then out of school for 5 days.
- Day 6-may return to school if no ongoing symptoms and no fever in the previous 24 hours.

ICT Updates

We want to remind you of a few things now that we are back in the swing of the school year:

- Your MacBook must have the district issued case on it at all times. (Failure to have the cover in place will result in confiscation of the MacBook.)
- 2. Please only carry your MacBook with the screen shut and with both hands to keep the machine secure.
- 3. Do not ever pick up the MacBook by the screen. The LCD is very sensitive and the pressure of your grip will break the screen.
- Keyboard covers should not be used since non-Apple keyboard covers might be too large and can put pressure on the screens and cause damage.
- 5. Please don't leave your MacBook in a car overnight.
- Needed programs can be found on Manager. You will not be able to download programs from the App Store for use on these devices.
- 7. Downloading VPNs (Virtual Private Networks) or other programs that mask your device on the network are a violation of the Responsible Use Policy you have agreed to. Use of these will result in the confiscation of the MacBook and you may MacBook access for the semester/school year for consistent violations.
- Due to the MacBook refresh this summer and the cost of the new hardware, the replacement device cost has gone up. Although, the charger cost has dropped. The incident fees have stayed the same (fees reset in high school).
 - 1. 1st Incident/Damaged Device fee: \$100.00
 - 2. 2nd Incident/Damaged Device fee: \$150.00
 - 3. 3rd and Subsequent Incident/Damage Device fee: Actual cost of repair/replacement or \$300.00 whichever is greater.

 - 5. Apple MacBook Air M1 Charger Replacement \$39
 - Apple MacBook Air M1 Adapter Set Replacement -\$58

MESSAGE FROM FOOD SERVICE

Students are able to purchase breakfast and lunch prepared by our food service staff. Students may also bring sack lunches from home.



<u>SM West does not allow for Door Dash deliveries or for fast food</u> to be delivered to students during the school day.

ONLY SENIORS are allowed to leave campus for lunch - WITH Parent Permission. More information about this privilege will be communicated to seniors soon, but will not begin until potentially after Labor Day.

2023-24 - Child Nutrition Program Meal Benefit Application

Families are encouraged to complete an application for meal benefits – free or reduced priced meals – as part of the Online Verification. The link to the Child Nutrition Program Meal Benefit Application is available on Skyward or the online application is on <u>School Cafe</u>. Families do need to create a School Cafe account if they do not already have one - more information may be located on the <u>SMSD Food Service Free and Reduced</u> web page. Contact the Food Service office by calling 913-993-9710 for questions on the meal benefit application.

Potential Benefits of Filling out the Application

Families, whose meal benefit application is approved for meal benefits, can receive a breakfast and lunch at the free or reduced price – depending on their qualifying benefit. Families who complete an application and qualify also generate additional state funds for our schools.

Families who qualify for child nutrition meal benefits, may receive additional benefits such as free/reduced instructional resource fees, transportation fees, and Pre-k enrollment.

Consent for Disclosure and Eligibility

Families are encouraged to complete a Consent for Disclosure form in<u>Skyward</u> which gives SMSD Food Service permission to share a child's eligibility status information with the programs families designate on the consent form.

Families who are receiving certain types of state assistance, a meal benefit application may not be necessary. If a family is directly certified for meal benefits due to state assistance, Food Service will email a notification of eligibility. If you receive state assistance and have not received a notification of eligibility, call the <u>SMSD Food Service office</u>before completing a meal program application. Families who are directly certified are encouraged to complete a Consent for Disclosure form in Skyward which gives SMSD Food Service permission to share a child's eligibility status information with the programs families designate on the consent form.

TRANSPORTATION UPDATE

ALL Students must be registered with DS Bus Lines in order to ride the bus.

Please note the following important information for 2023-24 busing:

- Bus registration may be found at the following link: <u>DS Bus</u>
 <u>Lines registration</u>
- 2023-24 bus fees will remain the same as the prior year.
 - \$185/semester/student or \$370/year/student
- Any student attending their home school and living 2.5 miles or more from the school qualifies for free busing.
 Registration is required.
- Students who qualify for the Child Nutrition Meal Benefits

 free and reduced priced meals may also qualify for free transportation, and enroll to ride existing routes. When registering, please provide a copy of the Child Nutrition Meal Benefits Eligibility letter to DS Bus Lines to complete the enrollment process. SMSD families can apply for Child Nutrition Meal Benefits after July 1st on School Café https://www.schoolcafe.com/SHAWNEEMISSION.
- Transportation changes put in effect during the 2022-23 school year will remain in effect for the 2023-24 school year. This includes limiting high school routes to students residing over 2.0 miles from their school.

- Bus routes and stop locations will be determined based on those who register for busing. A minimum number of registrations (50 paid) is required in order to offer a route.
- <u>Annual transportation registration is required for students</u> to receive bus service.

In the event there are times throughout the year when routes are running late and

notification is needed at the school and family level, we want to encourage you to sign up for Textcaster notifications.
