THE SCHOOL COMMUNITY

GISSV is a private, non-profit, co-educational college-preparatory school founded in 2000 in Mountain View, CA, the center of Silicon Valley. The academic programs of the GISSV are created to meet the needs of American, German and international families living in the Bay Area. GISSV has a second campus in San Francisco which opened in August, 2011. Over 40 nationalities are represented in our diverse student body and faculty. GISSV offers a multilingual, multicultural education to students from preschool through 12th grade.

ACCREDITATION

The GISSV is accredited by the Conference of German Cultural Ministers and by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), and the California Association of Independent Schools (CAIS) through June 2024. It is the only secondary school in the Western United States that meets the strict accreditation requirements of the German government, enabling entry into European as well as the American educational system.

THE ACADEMIC PROGRAM

- GISSV fulfills and exceeds all academic requirements for college-preparatory high schools in both Germany and the U.S., providing a rigorous curriculum including all major disciplines of the arts and sciences in a bilingual environment.
- Students graduating from GISSV receive two diplomas: the **German International Abitur Diploma** and the U.S. High School Diploma.
- Students take up to 13 different subjects in any given school year, including Math, English, German, at least two sciences, at least two social sciences, as well as Arts and P.E.
- Project-based, cross-curricular and independent learning opportunities put the emphasis on the development of critical thinking skills and a breadth of knowledge, resulting in a holistic and wellrounded education.
- In grades 10-12, students can choose from **11 AP and 14 Honors classes**.
- All examinations leading up to the final Abitur are required to test what are referred to as the three
 levels of thinking; the first level tests understanding of content and the ability to reproduce a text or
 mathematical problem; the second level involves analysis, exploration and interpretation; the third level
 called "transfer" tests the ability of the student to go beyond the text or mathematical problem to
 demonstrate or apply knowledge to another context. Multiple choice testing is not used in examinations
 at GISSV.
- GISSV does not rank students.
- The distribution of grades is not published due to the small number of students.

MATHEMATICS

GISSV requires four years of Math in high school. All classes are college-preparatory and taught according to German curricula, which is a high-rigor math progression that leads to Calculus Honors/AP and is more integrated in nature. In order to complete the dual-diploma program, students take Algebra 1 in grade 8. The high school math progression leads through concepts of Algebra 2, Geometry, Trigonometry, Statistics, Probability, and Calculus.

THE GERMAN INTERNATIONAL ABITUR

- Students take 3 written examinations in February of their senior year and two oral examinations in May. The five Abitur exams include German Literature, English or Mathematics and at least one Natural Science and Social Science and cover the entire material of the junior and senior years.
- The final grade for the German International Abitur includes the grades of both the junior and senior year as well as of the five Abitur examinations.
- Students must receive a C- or better in at least 29 semester grades of their junior and senior year.
- The final diploma the students receive qualifies for admission to universities and other tertiary institutions in Germany, Europe, and worldwide.
