# **Maryland Local School System Application and Certification**

June 24, 2020



### Purpose

Under the Governor's Emergency Education Relief Fund (GEER Fund), the U.S. Department of Education (Department) awards grants to Governors for the purpose of providing local educational agencies (LEAs), institutions of higher education (IHEs), and other education related entities with emergency assistance as a result of the Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19).

### **Timeline**

Local School System applications are due to MSDE by July 10, 2020.

### **Availability**

Funds are available for use from March 13, 2020 through September 30, 2022.

### **Uses of Funds**

Local School Systems are encouraged to utilize GEER funds to make investments in technology infrastructure and professional development that will improve capacity to provide high quality, accesible distance education or remote learning. However, any of the purposes listed in section 18003(d) of the CARES Act are allowable (See Appendix A.)

### PROGRAMMATIC, FISCAL, REPORTING, AND OTHER ASSURANCES

- The Local School System (LSS) will use GEER funds for activities allowable under section 18003(d) of Division B of the CARES Act. (See Appendix A.) The following is not considered to be an allowable use of ESSER funds, under any part of 18003: 1) subsidizing or offsetting executive salaries and benefits of individuals who are not employees of the LSS or 2) expenditures related to state or local teacher or faculty unions or associations.
- 2. The LSS will provide equitable services to students and teachers in non-public schools located within the LEA in the same manner as provided under section 1117 of the ESEA, as determined through timely and meaningful consultation with representatives of non-public schools.
  - The LSS will ensure that a public agency will maintain control of funds for the services and assistance provided to a non-public school under the GEER Fund.
  - The LSS will ensure that a public agency will have title to materials, equipment, and property purchased with GEER funds.
  - The LSS will ensure that services to a non-public school with GEER funds will be provided by a public agency directly, or through contract with, another public or private entity.
- 3. The LSS will, to the greatest extent practicable, continue to compensate its employees and contractors during the period of any disruptions or closures related to COVID-19 in compliance with Section 18006 of Division B of the CARES Act. CARES Act funds generally will not be used for bonuses, merit pay, or similar expenditures, unless related to disruptions or closures resulting from COVID-19.
- 4. The LSS will cooperate with any examination of records with respect to such funds by making records available for inspection, production, and examination, and authorized individuals available for interview and examination, upon the request of (i) the United States Department of Education (USDE) and/or its Inspector General; or (ii) any other federal agency, commission, or department in the lawful exercise of its jurisdiction and authority.
- 5. The LSS will comply with all applicable assurances in OMB Standard Forms 424B and D (Assurances for Non-Construction and Construction Programs), including the assurances relating to the legal authority to apply for assistance; access to records; conflict of interest; merit systems; nondiscrimination; Hatch Act provisions; labor standards; flood hazards; historic preservation; protection of human subjects; animal welfare; lead-based paint; Single Audit Act; and the general agreement to comply with all applicable Federal laws, executive orders and regulations.
- 6. LSS will submit the full certification, as set forth in 34 C.F.R. Part 82, Appendix A, upon request.
- 7. The LSS will sign and return the Assurances page of the Notice of Grant Award (NOGA)

- which includes a set of assurances that meets the requirements of section 442 of the General Education Provisions Act (GEPA) (20 U.S.C. 1232e).
- 8. To the extent applicable, an LEA will include in its local application a description of how the LEA will comply with the requirements of section 427 of GEPA (20 U.S.C. 1228a). The description must include information on the steps the LEA proposes to take to permit students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries to overcome barriers (including barriers based on gender, race, color, national origin, disability, and age) that impede equal access to, or participation in, the program.
- 9. The SEA will comply with the *Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards* (Uniform Guidance) requirements in Subpart D—Post Federal Award Requirements (2 CFR §§200.300-345) and Subpart E—Cost Principles (2 CFR §§200.400-475) to ensure that LEAs, including charter schools that are LEAs, are using ESSER funds for purposes that are reasonable, necessary, and allocable under the CARES Act.
- 10. The LSS and other entities will comply with the provisions of all applicable acts, regulations and assurances; the following provisions of Education Department General Administrative Regulations (EDGAR) 34 CFR parts 76, 77, 81, 82, 84, 97, 98, and 99; the OMB Guidelines to Agencies on Government-wide Debarment and Suspension (Non-procurement) in 2 CFR part 180, as adopted and amended as regulations of the Department in 2 CFR part 3485; and the Uniform Guidance in 2 CFR part 200, as adopted and amended as regulations of the USDE in 2 CFR part 3474.

#### Part I – Planned Use of GEER Funds

1. Please describe the Local School System's (LSSs) plans for utilizing the GEER funds including the timeline for implementing activities funded through this grant. Please include whether the activities will be a one-time or long-term benefit. If the LEA is not using the funds for technology-related activities, please explain why.

Cecil County Public Schools will be utilizing the GEER grant to increase the technology infrastructure. The grant funds will be used in two areas, hardware and technology applications.

1. Hardware to improve connectivity for students in areas of the county that may have limited access to high speed internet. CCPS will install external antennas at mulitple locations to allow students to access the CCPS secure Wifi from a location outside of the school building. The external atennas will be a long term benefit to the students.

CCPS also plans to create a robust virtualized classroom with video and high quality audio. The current teacher laptops do not have webcams so the webcams will allow students who are unable to attend school to see what is happening in the class and they will be able to participate using the webcam in the provided Chromebook. The webcam allows the teacher to have face to face interaction with the students in a virtual classroom setting. It is imperative to have quality audio for the virtual classroom. The teacher will not always be near the computer microphone, so the remote microphone will improve the sound quality for the student who is working remotely. The cameras and microphones will be a long term benefit as the school system expands remote learning options.

2. CCPS plans to add applications that will improve communication to all stakeholders. One application will allow the school system to electronically send all progress reports, interims and reports cards to parents in a safe, secure and effective manner. The other application is a mobile CCPS app that will allow parent to quickly receive all communications from the school system. These applications will be a long term benefit that the school system will need to budget in future years beyond the GEER grant period.

2. Please provide the LSS's plan for meeting the equitable services requirement in Section 18005 of the CARES Act.

After receiving the latest update, July 1,2020, from MSDE and USDE concerning Equitable Services, Cecil County has elected to use the total enrollment option. When that document was released to the LSS, Cecil County Public Schools reached out to all nonprofit nonpublic schools in Cecil County to explain the change in the ESSER grant along with information about the GEER grant. Each nonpublic was given the new letter of intent and affirmation of consultation form that MSDE provided. Each school quickly returned the appropriate forms with enrollment data for both the ESSER and GEER grant. See attached forms.

There were five nonpublic schools who were eligible to participate with a total enrollment of 1011 students. Cecil County Public Schools' enrollment on 9/30/19 was 14590 students.

CCPS used the following calculation for proportional equitable services.

Non-Public: 1011/(1011+14950) = 6.48% = \$10,033.66 CCPS: 14950/(1011+14950) = 93.52% = \$144,798.34

Total Cecil County GEER = \$154,832

Once the GEER grant application is approved, CCPS will meet with participating non-public schools do review each school's allotment.
