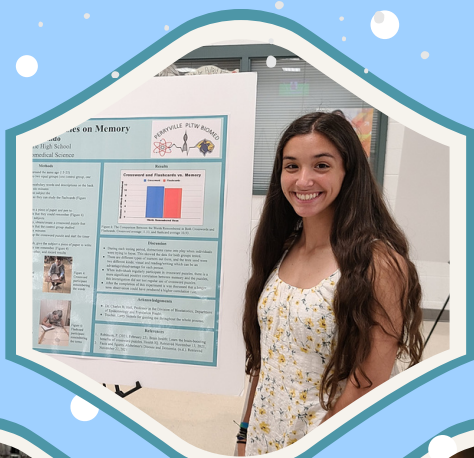

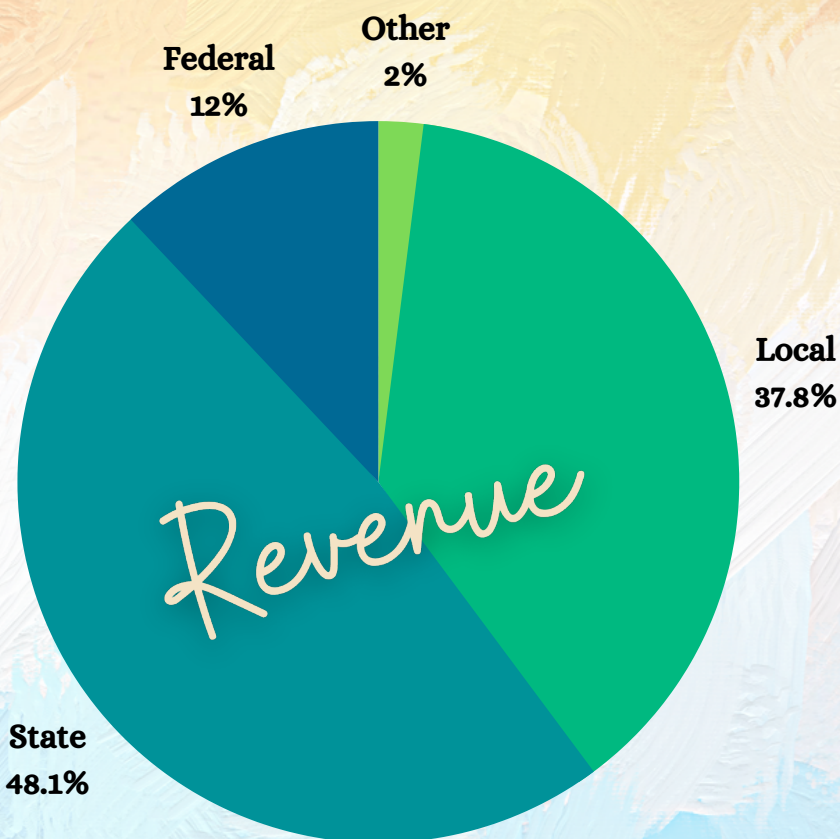
Message from the Superintendent

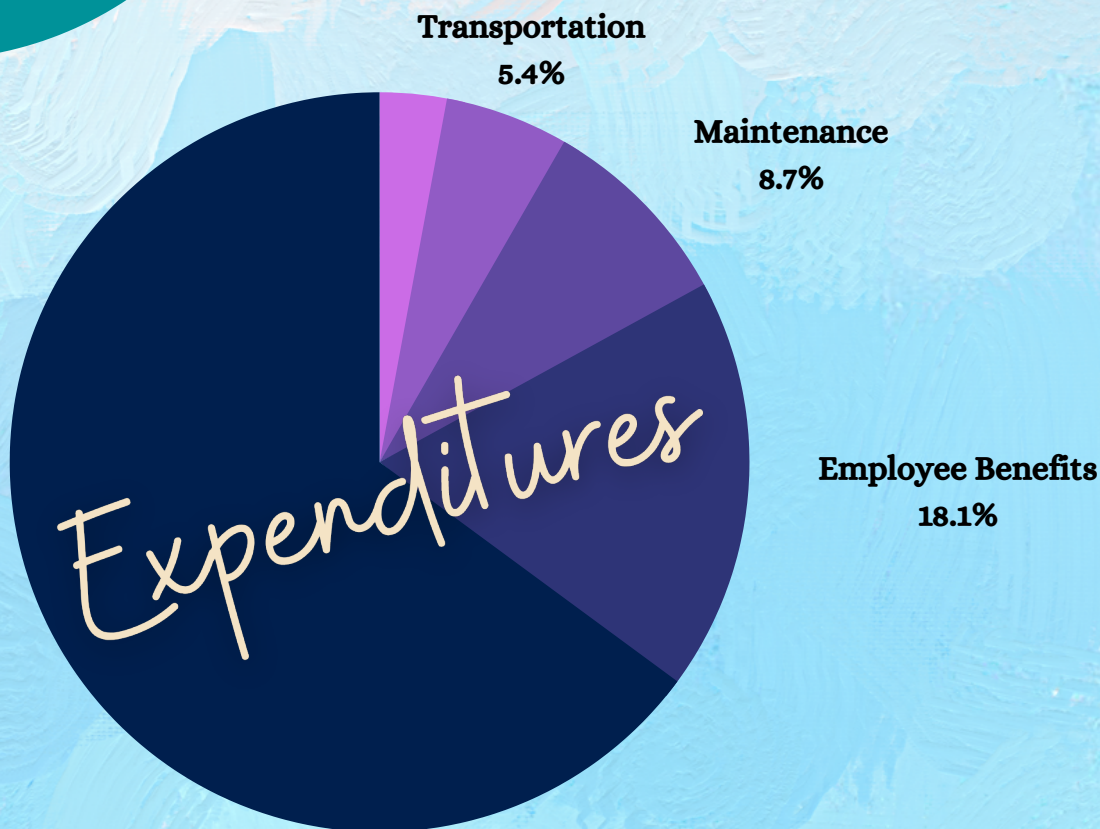

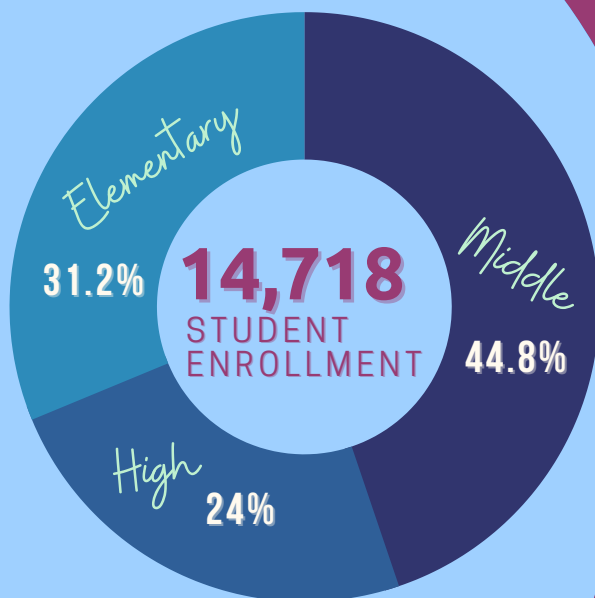
