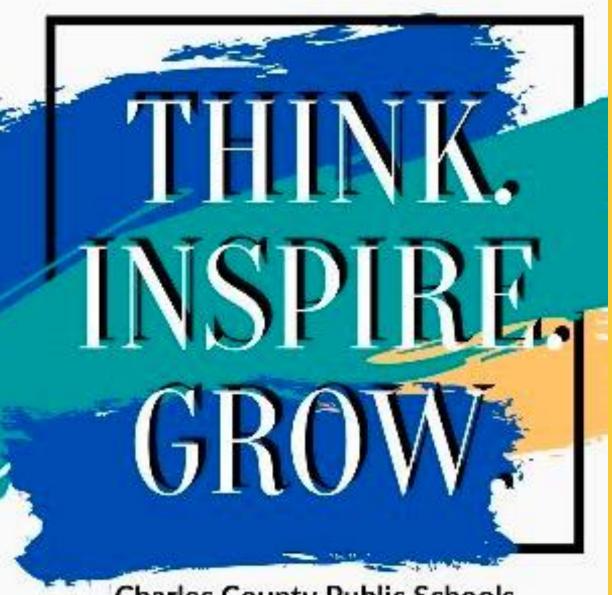

### School Improvement

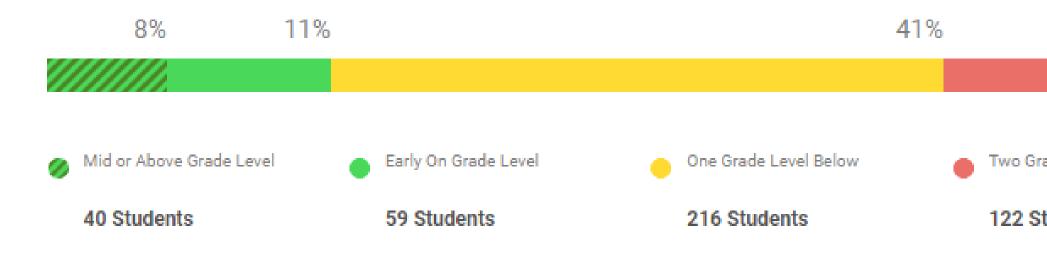

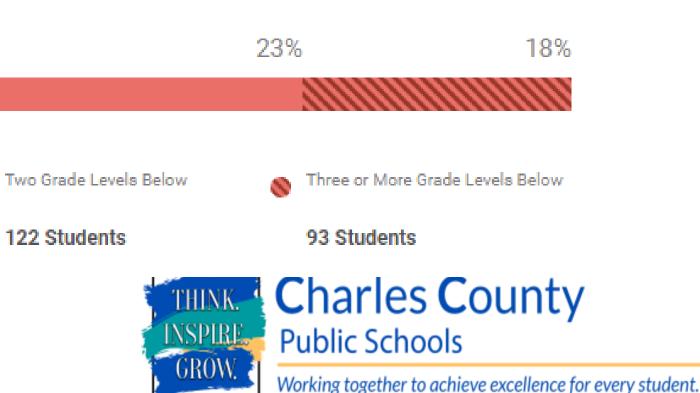
This works starts at the elementary school and continues through high school.

Data Summary: At the beginning of the school year 2023-2024, 18% of students are reading above or on grade level compared to 82% of students reading below grade level.

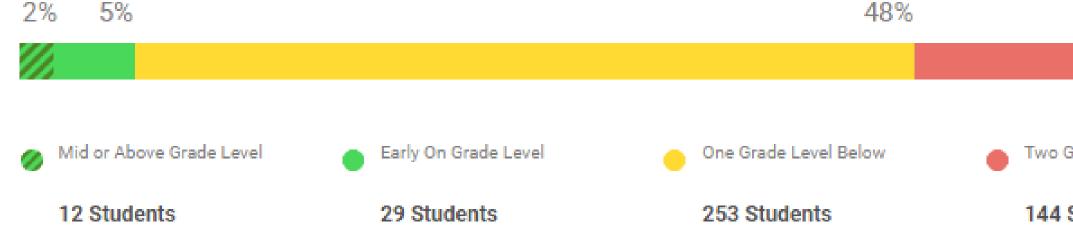

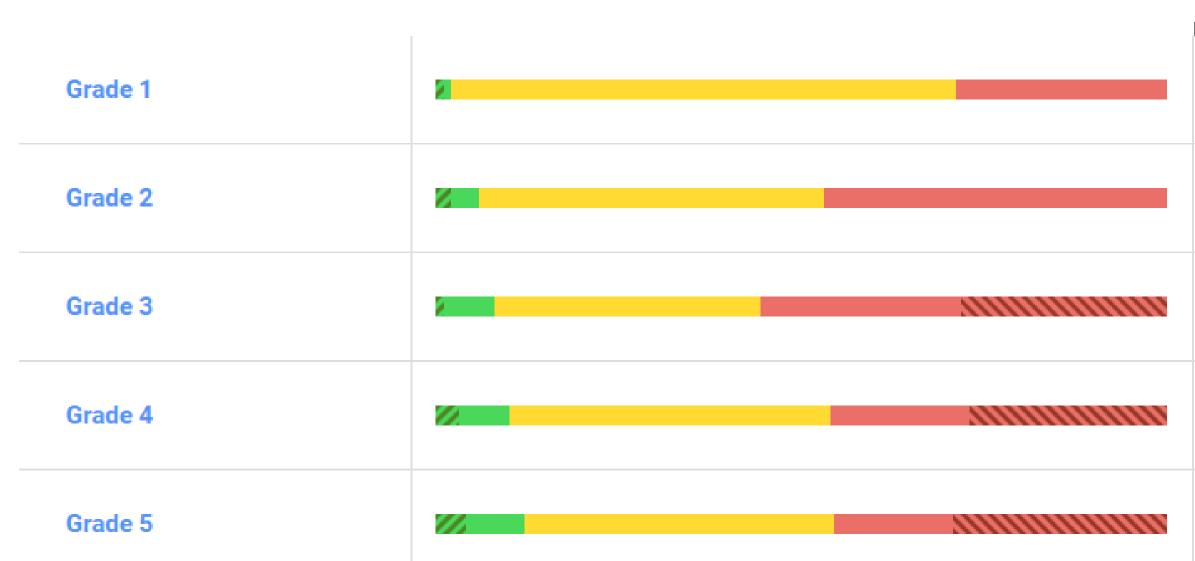

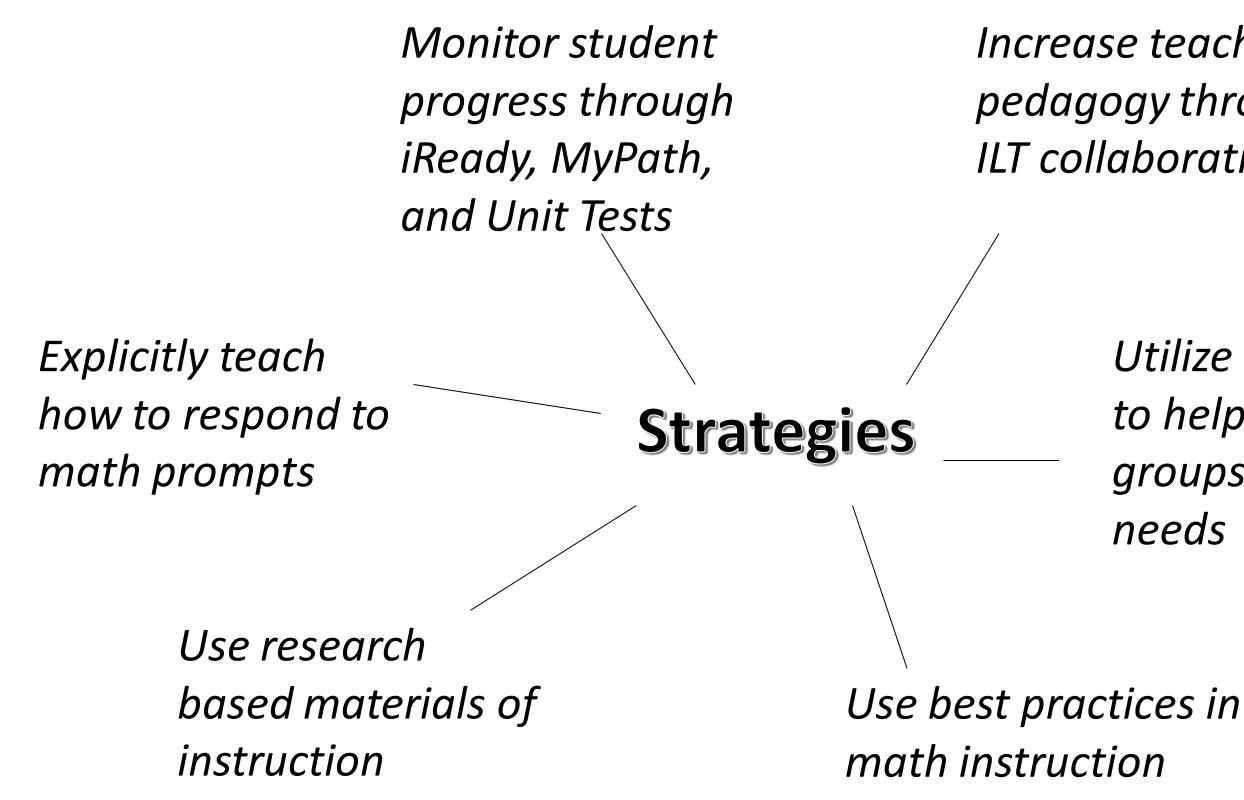

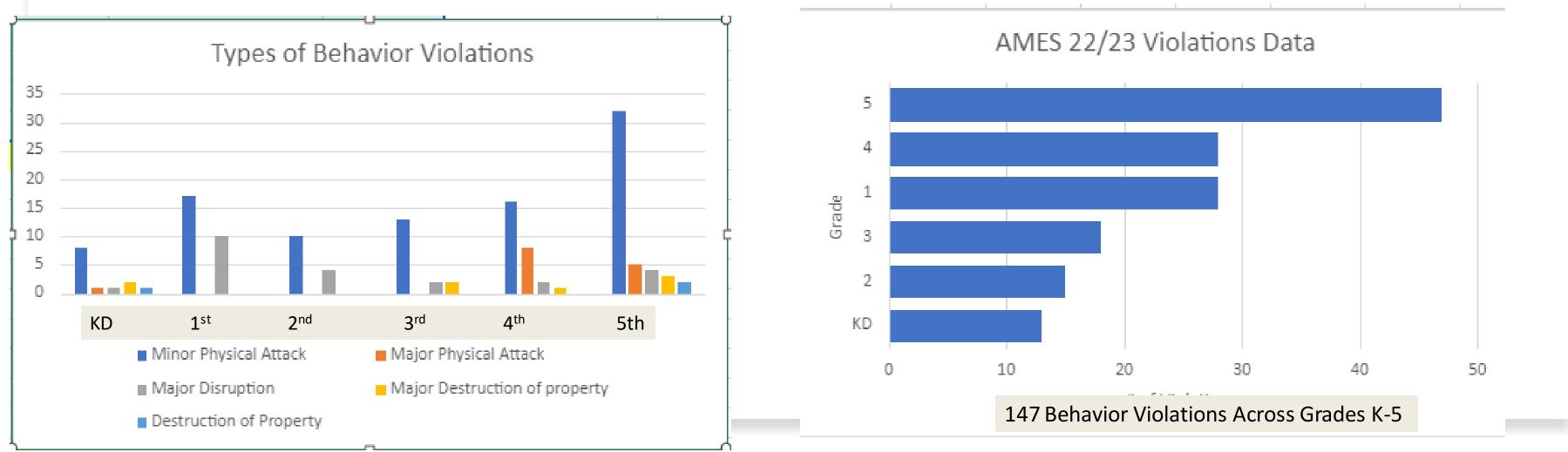

AMES has received a perception score of 1 for the Physical Safety topic on the MSS, signifying that it is the least favorable topic in comparison to others. This data reinforces our smart goal, with a clear focus on reducing the number of behavior incidents in the upcoming 23/24 school year.

### School Climate and Culture



The next data point was taken from the Synergy violations report.

Graph one illustrates that the majority of offenses consisted of minor physical attacks or altercations. Graph two reveals a total of 147 violations during the previous school year, with 47 incidents attributed to 5th-grade students.

This data substantiates the School Climate Smart Goal aimed at reducing behavior incidents by 20%.

## AMES Social Emotional strategies to support the school climate and culture goal.

- PD on Kagan strategies,
- Continue/Extend use of Zones of Regulation and Restorative Circles
- Move This World with fidelity across all grade levels
- Student written reflections (behavior based)
- Restorative Practices
- Class counseling lessons targeting decision making, coping strategies, and managing strong emotions
- Small group counseling targeting repeated offenders

- Character Breakfast
- Quarterly Awards Ceremonies
- Quarterly PBIS incentives
- PBIS to reward positive behaviors and create student expectations for behavior
- After school mentoring groups
- Positive office referrals, use of student support center (in-school intervention process)
- Progress monitoring of overall behaviors through use of PBIS monthly meetings.
- De-escalation training for all AMES staff
