



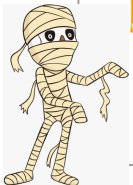

Five amazing years!

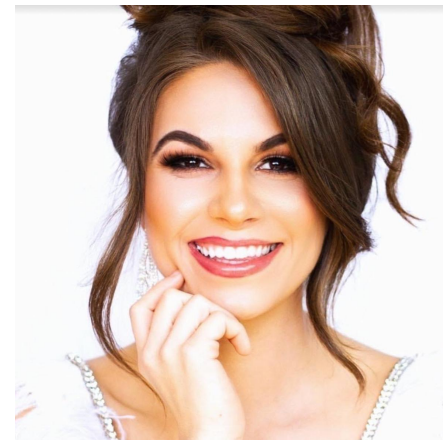
Do you still see yourself teaching at Puckett in the future:

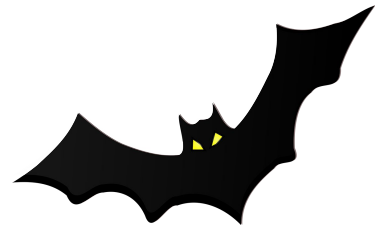

What did you do with the money you made?

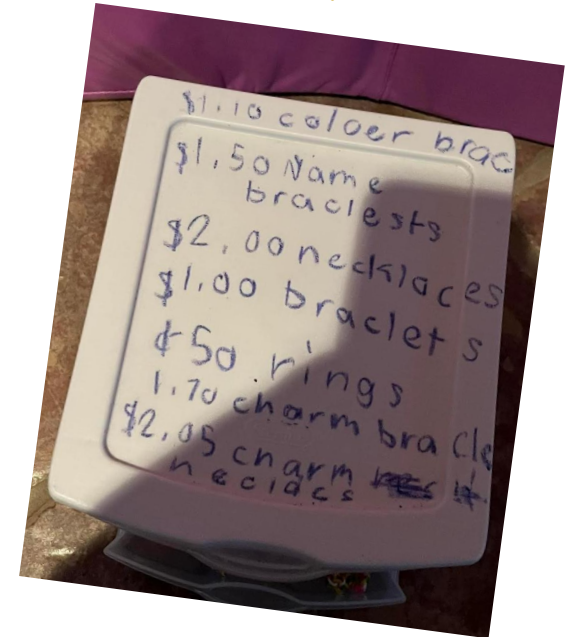
Hadley- We spent some to buy more bracelet stuff.
