
We have a lot of great things happening this year:

Students will receive many opportunities to discover, explore, and pursue in each grade level and throughout their Inspired Journey.









All student learning experiences align with our five career-field Pathways of Business & Management Human & Public Services, Natural & Applied Sciences,

Engineering, Technology & Manufacturing, and Communication & Arts.

DISCOVER

During the **DISCOVER** portion of the journey, students begin to uncover their strengths, talents and interests as they sample a variety of topics.

NEW THIS YEAR:

Watch for "Discovery Groups" at each of our elementary schools! In these small groups, students drive their own learning in areas that interest them and make early connections to our five career-field Pathways.



WATCH: Examples from last year at Cedar Ridge and Eden Lake

EXPLORE

As students **EXPLORE**, they dive deeper into their interests and have opportunities to become curious about and build skills across many disciplines Many middle school courses are designed to foster exploration.

PURSUE

At the **PURSUE** stage, students take their interests to the next level to achieve their goals, including by taking one of 11 Capstone courses. Coursework and extracurricular experiences are aligned so students are prepared for life after high school.

Since Eden Prairie's earliest days, its residents have believed deeply in the power of community and the importance of education. In fact, the town board of Eden Prairie held its first meeting in a log schoolhouse on May 11, 1858 - the same day Minnesota became a state. That log schoolhouse would remain a hub of community for decades to come, and today, the school community it helped to create celebrates 100 Years of Inspiring Each.

The Eden Prairie Consolidated School, which is now the district's Administrative Services Center, first welcomed students in March 1924. As one of the first electrified buildings in Eden Prairie, it went on to be an important gathering place for all residents, providing space for movies, voting, weddings and clothes ironing!
